54 We'll move on to our second item on the agenda, which is audience comments. This is the time that if anyone

would like to address the Board, and bring a concern of theirs to our attention, you have three minutes to

- 56 present your item. And, we would invite you to come forward now and announce your name and address for the
- 57 record, and whatever information that you have to bring to us. Is there anybody who'd like to make a comment?
- 58 Come forward.
- 59 Spv. Berube:
- 60 Dan, are you noticing that the recording thing is going on and off? Should it be doing that?
- 61 Spv. Leet:
- 62 Yeah, it's recording it online. So, it should be fine.
- 63 Spv. Berube:
- 64 Okay.
- 65 Spv. Leet:
- 66 And then, we have another recording.
- 67 District Manager Montagna:
- 68 And I'm recording it.
- 69 Spv. Berube:
- 70 I'm just watching that screen, and it's on and off.
- 71 Spv. Kramer:

- 72 Okay.
- 73 Spv. Berube:
- 74 Sorry to interrupt you, sir, but recording it is important.
- 75 Jason Webber:

76 That's perfectly fine. So, my name's Jason Webber, I live at 7048 Buttonbush Loop. I moved here, I've been a 77 resident of Harmony for about five years, but we moved into this residence in April. During that time, we 78 identified a tree in the front of the home, that's actually between the curb and the sidewalk, that's actually raised 79 the pavement beyond what's acceptable. Having formerly lived on Brackenfern, the sidewalk at that time had 80 been elevated slightly, that was completely replaced. The sidewalk over here is ridiculously raised. So, I'm advocating that we replace that. Two, I'm also asking the Board if you can assess my front porch. I believe roots 81 82 are actually pushing up the base of my front porch. And I think they've reached the perimeter of the porch, and 83 they're pushing up, where my actual tiles are actually starting to break. And so, I'd like to have this reviewed or 84 assessed. I received an email from a gentleman, forgive me, the name escapes me. But I was told that Aramark

89 Inframark does not replace patios. But I have a situation that needs to be looked at. And so, that's what I'm

- 91 Spv. Kramer:
- 92 Okay.
- 93 Spv. Berube:
- 94 Can you go over your address again?
- 95 Jason Webber
- 96 7048 Button Bush Loop.
- 97 Spv. Berube:
- 98 Okay.
- 99 Jason Webber:
- 100 I've sent a few emails, and I've had quite a few dialogs with some people. Which I was invited to come out tonight
- 101 to talk to you about it.
- 102 District Manager Montagna:
- 103 Absolutely. Brett, do you want to go over it, or do you want me to?
- 104 Area Field Director Perez



- 105 Yeah, I can.
- 106 District Manager Montagna:
- 107 Okay.
- 108 Area Field Director Perez
- 109 I can.
- 110 District Manager Montagna:
- 111 Address it now?
- 112 Spv. Kramer:
- 113 Well, this is typically-
- 114 District Manager Montagna:
- 115 If not, we can address it later.
- 116 Spv. Kramer:
- 117 Audience comments.
- 118 District Manager Montagna:
- 119 Okay.
- 120 Spv. Kramer:
- 121 As our attorney can explain to you, as roots go past, once they've passed the property line, they're no longer our
- 122 responsibility.
- 123 Jason Webber
- 124 Interesting.
- 125 Spv. Kramer:
- As with tree limbs. We're trying to deal with that. We will take it under advisement and take the proper steps, as necessary.
- 128 Jason Webber
- 129 Please. It's at a point where the pavement is raised.
- 130 Spv. Kramer:
- 131 Yes, the sidewalk grinding, we're-
- 132 Jason Webber
- 133 It's literally raised-



- 134 Spv. Kramer:
- 135 ...going to get right on it.
- 136 Jason Webber
- 137 ...to which the actual walkway's pushed down and things are off key.
- 138 Spv. Berube:
- 139 Yeah. We have hundreds of panels that elect that we're... That's coming up, I don't see it on the agenda tonight,
- 140~ but in a short period of time here, sidewalks will be addressed, town wide.
- 141 Jason Webber
- 142 Okay. Closing comment, my sprinkler systems have also been destroyed, as a result of root systems. And so,
- 143 yeah, what, can you give me at least a timeline, in which this will be addressed, because I remember-
- 144 District Manager Montagna:
- 145 I'd love to.
- 146 Jason Webber
- 147 I remember speaking to Gerhard back in April/May. He did a site survey. And we're, now, in February, so we're 148 almost a year...
- 149
- 150 Spv. Berube:
- 151 Yes.
- 152 Jason Webber
- 153 Do you have a, a reasonable timeframe, that I can expect the response? I'm at a point where I can't really do 154 anything with my front yard, until I remove all the root systems.
- 155 Spv. Berube:
- 156 Sidewalk management.
- 157 District Manager Montagna:
- 158 The sidewalk in front of his home.
- 159 Spv. Berube:
- 160 Yeah. Timeframe?
- 161 Area Field Director Perez:
- 162 I've got two proposals coming. But we'll send Vincent out there, to make any grinds that we need to make. The
- 163 panel replacements, we have proposals coming.
- 164 Spv. Berube

- 165 Okay.
- 166 Area Field Director Perez:
- 167 They should've been here for this meeting, but both vendors didn't provide them in time.
- 168 Spv. Berube:
- 169 More than likely, it will be on next month's agenda. Someone will be out, fairly soon, potentially to grind up any
- 170 high points. And then, potentially, we'll be replacing panels down the road.
- 171 Jason Webber
- 172 Well, I appreciate your time and assistance.
- 173 Spv. Kassel:
- 174 It's a long process, because, first, we have to, we have to contract with the engineer to do a sidewalk inventory,
- that inventory, then, has to be prepared, presented to the Board, and then we have to find vendors, after that.
- 176 It's...
- 177 Jason Webber
- 178 Well, so cutting to the chase, if I was to remove the tree, out of pocket, as well as replace the panels of 179 pavement-
- 180 Spv. Kassel:
- 181 You'd have to-
- 182 Jason Webber
- 183 ...would the Board -
- 184 Spv. Kramer:
- 185 We'd be very upset.
- 186 Jason Webber
- 187 ...reimburse me?
- 188 Spv. Berube:
- 189 No.
- 190 Jason Webber
- 191 Would the board reimburse me?
- 192 Spv. Kramer:
- 193 And the county would be... I mean-
- 194 Spv. Berube:

- 195 No.
- 196 Spv. Kassel:
- 197 No.
- 198 Jason Webber
- 199 No?
- 200 Spv. Kramer:
- 201 No.
- 202 Spv. Kassel:
- 203 Yeah, those are CDD trees, right?
- 204 Spv. Kramer:
- 205 They're protected.
- 206 Spv. Kassel:
- You know, Harmony is trees. So, they belong to the CDD, and we have a contract to keep them off the houses,and we have contracts to trim them up. But-
- 209 Jason Webber
- 210 Right.
- 211 Spv. Kassel:
- 212 Unfortunately, this is a developer generated issue, where planting large trees between a curb and a sidewalk is
- 213 inevitably going to cause this kind of problem. And the CDD cannot be responsible for every single house where
- that's happening.
- 215 Jason Webber
- 216 I respect that completely. Again, so I'm advocating for the removal of the tree, and the repair of the pavement.
- 217 And the assessment of-
- 218 Spv. Berube:
- 219 The removal of the tree won't fix the problem, the roots will remain.
- 220 Jason Webber
- 221 Of course, I understand that.
- 222 Spv. Berube:
- 223 But what will happen, when the panel gets replaced, the panel will get lifted, any protruding roots will get cut.
- 224 That should stop further growth of those roots onto your property.



- 225 Jason Webber
- 226 Right.
- 227 Spv. Berube:
- Now, the panel will grow down, and the tree will probably zig-zag it's roots to somewhere else. But at least, the immediate ongoing growth, on your end, should stop, because the roots will be cut.
- 230 Jason Webber
- 231 Right, so-
- 232 Spv. Berube:
- 233 Doesn't solve the entire problem, but-
- 234 Jason Webber
- Well, the-
- 236 Spv. Kramer:
- 237 Okay, I'm sorry, I...
- 238 Jason Webber
- 239 I've exceeded my three minutes.
- 240 Spv. Kramer:
- 241 Yeah, the three minutes was for you to state your problem, and-
- 242 Jason Webber
- 243 Okay.
- 244 Spv. Kramer:
- 245 ....we're not supposed to go back and forth-
- 246 Spv. Berube:
- We got it.
- 248 Jason Webber
- All right. So-
- 250 Spv. Kramer:
- 251 ...in this session, so.

330	Maintenance wise, I'm sure we all see it, leaves.

332	The guys have been working all week, cleaning up the streets. And if you drive through now

- Now, that was quick.
- 347 Spv. Kramer:
- 348 Okay. So, you're not doing anything but leaves, or?
- 349 Pete Betancourt:
- 350 On my end, irrigation. I know that's a big topic.
- 351 Spv. Kramer:
- 352 Yes.
- 353 District Manager Montagna:
- 354 Shh.
- 355 Pete Betancourt:

The stuck valve, corner of Five Oaks and Cat Brier, has been replaced. I got to send Brett the pictures. The mainline, Schoolhouse, we dug it up today. Cut the line and drained it. We're going to put the new pipe in tomorrow.

- 359 Spv. Kramer:
- 360 Okay. It will be purple pipe, right?
- 361 Pete Betancourt:
- 362 Yeah.
- 363 Spv. Kramer:
- 364 I saw a lot of white, down in there.
- 365 Pete Betancourt:
- 366 But the pipe is purple.
- 367 Spv. Kramer:
- 368 Okay.
- 369 Pete Betancourt:
- The slip fix is going to be white, but we'll use purple pipe.
- 371 Spv. Kramer:
- 372 Yes.



- 373 Pete Betancourt:
- If we need to.
- 375 Spv. Kramer:
- 376 Make sure of that.
- 377 Kirk Allen
- I will introduce myself. I'm Kirk Allen, with Servello. I'm the Irrigation Manager and the Horticulture Manager forthe company.
- 380 Spv. Kramer:
- Wonderful.
- 382 Kirk Allen

383 And helping out with Pete, I thought he was going to stay up here, but what we talked about with the flow of the 384 water that was leaking at Schoolhouse wasthat may have been a small leakand when the sidewalk was cut out 385 and the curb was cut out, it was more exposed, and it showed itself with more flow of water. So, there was 386 probably pressure holding the pipe together better, and it opened up. With that being said, there's been some 387 times where some things have happened out on a property, where I feel I should be out here on a weekly basis to 388 monitor the Maxicom and make sure things are operational, and also the clocks and the maintenance on both 389 the fertilizer and pest control side and the irrigation side. But that is what I would offer at this time. I also feel 390 that, in the past, on the Maxicom, that, Mike Walker, with Walker Technical Services, has provided some service 391 here. And as far as the last time he was here, I'm not sure if he's gone through the system, or is that, if that's 392 something that the Board or community would like him to do, offer a service for, or not.

- 393 Spv. Berube:
- 394 It was probably seven years ago; the last time Mr. Walker was around. Maybe a little bit longer?
- 395 Spv. Leet:

396 Yeah. Well, we did briefly speak with him, when we were setting up the new computer, to run the Maxicom,

- 397 probably about a year ago. We just talked with him. We were able to just get it kind of back up and running, with 398 a newer computer. So, we didn't engage him.
- 399 Kirk Allen
- 400 Okay.
- 401 Spv Berube

Since Field Services got established, Mr. Walker was-did the transition into letting Field Services operate it. And
 that was 2016, I guess, so six, seven years and he hasn't been here since.

- 404 Kirk Allen
- 405 Okay.
- 406 Spv. Kramer:



- 407 Okay. Now, is he a certified Maxicom...
- 408 Kirk Allen:
- 409 Yes.
- 410 Spv. Berube:
- 411 He is...
- 412 Kirk Allen:
- 413 The best person I know.
- 414 Spv. Berube:
- 415 About the only one.
- 416 Kirk Allen:
- 417 Yeah. I believe he used to work for Rain Bird, who developed Maxicom, assisted in developing Maxicom.
- 418 Spv. Berube:
- 419 Correct.
- 420 Spv. Berube:
- 421 You mentioned, you think you should be here weekly. Is there...we're not holding you back. I mean.
- 422 Kirk Allen
- 423 No, I'm going to be here.
- 424 Spv. Kramer:
- 425 He's going to be here more often.
- 426 Kirk Allen

427 No, I mean, through managing the department, I've seen that there seems to be, with the age of the system and

- 428 you have trees and we have high winds, then the tree moves and we have breaks, we have mainline breaks, we 429
- have valves that stick on because of that, and different things have been happening.
- 430 Spv. Berube:
- 431 Sure.
- 432 Kirk Allen
- 433 I think it'd be in the best interest for me to be out here more often and be able to help the community.
- 434 Spv. Kramer:
- 435 Great. That would be wonderful.



- 436 Kirk Allen
- 437 Okay.
- 438 Spv. Kramer:
- I was communicating with the folks at Toho, we have an extremely high bill on one of the meters. I don't know, itis the meter at Cupseed and Schoolhouse?
- 441 Kirk Allen
- 442 That's the meter... Right?
- 443 Spv. Kramer:
- 444 They said that, I mean it jumped from a couple of hundred to \$3000 this month. Do we have any idea what's
- going on with that? She said it was not the meter that ran the break at the school. Now, I'm not sure about that.
- 446 But so I presume it's not that one. Do we have another leak along Schoolhouse, near Cupseed?
- 447 Pete Betancourt:
- 448 There's another meter past the school, over by Pond Pine, after that meter.
- 449 Spv. Berube:
- 450 Pond Pine?
- 451 Pete Betancourt:
- 452 Yeah.
- 453 Spv. Kassel:
- 454 That's my corner, right?
- 455 Pete Betancourt:
- 456 Yeah.
- 457 Spv. Berube:
- 458 That's a long way away.
- 459 Spv. Kramer:
- 460 Yeah. I don't know if that's the one, or not. But we need to track this down, because if we get another bill like 461 this-
- 462 Pete Betancourt:
- 463 The bill that I saw that Brett sent me, said 0 Cupseed and Schoolhouse.
- 464 Spv. Kramer:
- 465 Right.



466	Spv. Berube:
467	Right. That's the corner.
468	Pete Betancourt:
469	That's the corner, that's the meter, over by the electrical box.
470	Spv. Kramer:
471	Okay.
472	Pete Betancourt:
473	That's the meter that runs-
474	Spv. Kramer:
475	And what does that serve?
476	Pete Betancourt:
477	That feeds all of Schoolhouse.
478	Pete Betancourt:

526	But where's the water coming from?
527	Pete Betancourt:
528	A lateral line will feed off that zone.
529	Spv. Berube:
530	When the sprinkler runs, you'll get water-
531	Pete Betancourt:
532	When the sprinkler runs, when the valve turns on the water there, that's where the water goes.
533	Kirk Allen:
534	But if it's a mainline that feeds-
535	Spv. Kramer:
536	But it doesn't look like that line is leaking.
537	Kirk Allen:
538	It would, water would be coming out of those,
539	Pete Betancourt:
540	Well, if you look, I checked it out, before I came here if you look at the hole, you see the line. The line could be
541	Spv. Kramer:
542 543	Oh, you- saw a break? Yeah, I see the line.
544 545	Pete Betancourt:
545	over here or it could be over here.
546	Spv. Kramer:
547	Okay, so the break could be on either side and washing it out.
548	Pete Betancourt:
549	And then, that's where it washed out.
550	Spv. Kramer:
551	Okay.
552	Pete Betancourt:
553	So, it could be at either end. What we have to do is cut the roots out, dig it out, and see where the break is.



554	Spv. Kramer:
555	Okay, so that may be what.
556	Pete Betancourt:
557	That could also contribute to it, yeah.
558	Spv. Kramer:
559	Okay.
560	Spv. Berube:
561	\$3000 jump is a lot of water.
562	Kirk Allen:
563 564	But it's not. It's not going to… A mainline leak would be where it would be constant water flowing. That's where you get the high water bill from.
565	
566	Spv. Kramer:
567	I think on one of them, there was a, a full break, I mean one day showed 130,000 gallons of water. Is that -
568	Pete Betancourt:
569	That's a mainline. That would be the mainline.
570	Spv. Kramer:
571	Okay.
572	Spv. Kramer:
573	I've presumed you've fixed it, because it was just for one day.
574	Spv. Berube:
575	Yeah, but that much water would create a significant flood on the road. 130,000 gallons in a day.
576	Kirk Allen:
577	If it's that one? Yeah. If it's that one, it would be constant, though. If it was constant.
578	Spv. Berube:
579	Because think about it-
580	Kirk Allen
581	It would be a constant every day.
582	Spv. Berube:
583	you fill up the swimming pool-



-	Kirk Allen It'd be every day.
)	Spv. Berube: which 72,000 gallons, costs \$240.
)	Spv. Kramer: Right.
)	Spv. Berube: So if you get a \$3000 bill for reclaimed water-
	Spv. Kramer: That's huge.

- 611 It can.
- 612 Spv. Berube:



- 613 Something's wrong there.
- 614 Spv. Kramer:
- 615 So, we need to find-
- 616 Scottie Feliciano:
- 617 Well, one thing we got, let me...
- 618 Spv. Berube:
- 619 Hey, Scottie! We forgot about you! Come on up and join the party!
- 620 Scottie Feliciano:
- 621 One of the things we need to do is., and this is why Kirk's going to come down here, weekly.
- 622 Spv. Kramer:
- 623 Mm-hmm (affirmative).
- 624 Scottie Feliciano:
- 625 Maxicom should be catching it. Okay? And the system should alert you. And what the system typically does, it 626 shuts down the irrigation system, shut down the mainline, or something.
- 627 Spv. Berube:
- 628 Not our Maxicom.
- 629 Scottie Feliciano:
- 630 Uh, excuse me?
- 631 Spv. Berube:
- 632 Not our Maxicom.
- 633 Scottie Feliciano:
- 634 Not your Maxicom?
- 635 Spv. Berube:
- 636 It wll not do that.
- 637 Kirk Allen
- 638 Yeah, right.
- 639 Spv. Berube:
- 640 We don't-
- 641 Scottie Feliciano:



- 642 It doesn't-
- 643 Spv. Berube:
- 644 have flow meters on it, so it doesn't know.
- 645 Kirk Allen
- 646 Right.
- 647 Scottie Feliciano:
- 648 Wow.
- 649 Spv. Berube:
- 650 Maxicom has no idea what's going on. We got into the flow meter thing, a few years back, the price was through 651 the roof.
- 652 Scottie Feliciano:
- 653 Yeah, because we used them all at the Targets, back in the day. And it was a pretty simple system where it shuts654 down the entire system and it alerts you if there's a leak or anything on it.
- 655 Spv. Berube:
- 656 When this got put in, it was done as cheap as possible, just spray water on the grass, end of story. We figured this 657 ou, over the last decade.
- 658 Kirk Allen
- 659 Yeah.
- 660 Spv. Berube:
- 661 Upgrading it was-
- 662 Scottie Feliciano:

663 Well, one of the problems, then, that you can have, if you do have a pinhole leak, on a mainline, and it's 664 underneath, and it's shooting down, sometimes you won't even discover that for a month.

- 665 Spv. Berube:
- 666 Right.
- 667 Scottie Feliciano:
- 668 Or even months at a time.
- 669 Spv. Berube:
- 670 Well, we got the first month.
- 671 Kirk Allen



- 672 That's what we were talking about, when the sidewalk got pulled out, it loosened up the pipe, to allow more
- 673 water to come through.
- 674 Spv. Berube:
- 675 Yeah, because there was no
- 676 water coming up, until they busted up the sidewalk.
- 677 Kirk Allen
- 678 Right, right.
- 679 Spv. Berube:
- 680 There wasn't any water coming up, then all of a sudden-
- 681 Pete Betancourt:
- All of a sudden, yep.
- 683 Kirk Allen
- 684 It's just like when a tree moves the mainline, it's got a hairline crack, and then it has a big crack.
- 685 Spv. Berube
- 686 Well, you're-
- 687 Spv. Kramer:
- 688 Unfortunately, at that location, we have semis delivering supplies at the school-
- 689 Spv. Berube:
- 690 Oh, of course. I mean they run over the curb.
- 691 Spv. Kramer:
- 692 So-
- 693 Spv. Berube:
- 694 Yeah, I noticed.
- 695 Spv. Kramer:
- 696 I think that's what caused it initially.
- 697 Scottie Feliciano:
- That's kind of unfortunate, you know, because the Maxicom basically serves really that purpose was what it was intended to be installed. I mean, it's just like a remote control on an irrigation system.
- 700 Spv. Kassel:
- 701 Thank you, Developer.



- 702 Spv. Berube:
- 703 Mike Walker says this, "We have a Cadillac priced system, with an old Chevette engine driving it." You remember
- the Chevettes, right?
- 705 Spv. Kramer:
- 706 Do we know what it would cost to retrofit our Maxicom system? Or has..
- 707 Spv. Berube:
- 708 Yes, we do.
- 709 Spv. Kramer:
- 710 ...that ship sailed?
- 711 Spv. Berube:
- 712 Supervisor Kassel probably remembers this. When we get into the retrofit of flow meters, the low number was
- about \$60,000. The high number could easily have gone over \$100,000. The problem being, we don't know...
- There's wires in the ground, spread around. You see the little caps. We don't know the quality of those wires.
- 715 We're not sure where they're connected. There's no, we'd have to go back and try to find that.
- 716 Scottie Feliciano:
- 717 Yeah, so it's useless doing it right now.
- 718 Spv. Berube:
- 719 Right.
- 720 Scottie Feliciano:
- And you're going to go well over \$100,000, probably \$200,000. Plus the wires are probably tangled in tree roots, and everything else.
- 723 Spv. Berube:
- The flip side of that was they have wireless,
- 725 Kirk Allen
- Flow meters.
- 727 Spv. Berube:
- flow meters now.

729 But you'd have to have sending units around, you'd have to put a wireless in the trailer, where the computer is,

and all that. It's still going to be 60 to \$100,000. The, and when you look at, the payback on that, it was hard to

figure. But if you took 10% a year in savings, from broken meters that it catches, broken lines, you had a 10 to 15

year minimum payback. Maybe, if it works, right? So that was the, the reasoning, and that's why we didn't do it at

- that time.
- 734 Kirk Allen



- 735 So, on a weekly basis, checking the meter for the reading would be our way to do-
- 736 Spv. Kramer:
- And, Toho, when you check with them, they can give you real-time data. They can look at a meter and they can see if it's leaking. If something in the line is leaking.
- 739 Spv. Berube:
- 740 Yeah, they know when something's going on, because they sent notifications.
- 741 Kirk Allen
- 742 Yeah, that is what I said, they'd send you a notification.
- 743 Spv. Kramer:
- 744 So, they will work with you on that.
- 745 Kirk Allen
- 746 Okay. Well, that's an avenue for me-
- 747 Spv. Kramer:
- 748 Instead of having to run out to the meters all the time.
- 749 Spv. Berube:
- 750 There's a, there's a pretty cooperative guy, over there, Rodney, I forget his last name. But he'll know, if you call
- him and tell him the Harmony CDD.
- 752 He's a water conservation guy.
- 753 And he's been out a few times.
- 754 Kirk Allen
- 755 I'll do that tomorrow.
- 756 Spv. Kramer:
- 757 So, we can set you up with that.
- 758 Kirk Allen
- 759 Okay. Thank you.
- 760 Spv. Kramer:
- 761 We'll do that. Any other questions of Servello?
- 762 Spv. Berube:
- 1 do. Buck Lane Park, the resurfacing of that. This is probably a conglomeration between you, and them, you
- know, the fake grass, and all that. I mean, if you looked at Buck Lane Park, it's pretty bad.



- 765 Area Field Director Perez:
- 766 Yeah.
- 767 Spv. Berube:
- 768 Where do we stand with redoing that?
- 769 Area Field Director Perez:
- 770 Getting proposals.
- 771 Spv. Berube:
- 772 From?
- 773 Spv. Kramer
- 774 Now, Buck Lane Park-
- 775 Scottie Feliciano:
- 776 Artificial turf?
- 777 Spv. Kramer:
- 778 If we were talking about-
- 779 Spv. Berube:
- 780 Yes.
- 781 Spv. Kramer:
- 782 artificial turf, we don't know... What we've got is we've got a group of probably 15 kids-
- 783 Spv. Berube:
- 784 This is right next door to my house.
- 785 Spv. Kramer:
- 786 ...that just, I mean, they play out there all, all the time that they're out of school. Constantly. And ever since we 787 cut everything down, to let it grow back, they saw that as an opportunity, of course. They're kids, it is a park. So,
- 788 we're looking for alternatives, reasonable cost alternatives to keep it from being a mud hole.
- 789 Scottie Feliciano:
- 790 Okay. Pete, get the square footage of it, send it over to me. I know a company that does artificial turf. He's done a 791 few pools, that we-
- 792 Spv. Berube:

793 We don't have to have artificial turf. But it seems like it's the only likely logical solution for the kind of traffic it 794 gets.

795 Scottie Feliciano:

Right, right. Well, you're not going to be able to put any type of turf on it. Period. So, it would be artificial turf, or,
 you don't want to do mulch or anything like that.

- 798 Spv. Berube:
- 799 No.
- 800 Scottie Feliciano:
- 801 Rock or nothing, so-
- 802 Spv. Berube:
- 803 It's a playground.
- 804 Scottie Felciano:
- 805 Right.
- 806 Spv. Berube:
- 807 It's a playground.
- 808 Scottie Feliciano:
- 809 Right.
- 810 Spv. Berube:
- 811 Okay. Every time I look at it, it's like, "You know, we talked about this, six months ago." The other one's related to
- sod, in general, specifically along Cat Brier. We've had this conversation, all over, over and over and over.
- 813 Spv. Kassel:
- 814 Several of us went out and took a look, about a month and a half ago, two months ago.
- 815 Area Field Director Perez:
- 816 It was two, yeah. Before Christmas.
- 817 Spv. Kassel:

818 We took a look, and it was not consistent. What I saw was not consistent. There were areas where the leaves had 819 just not been picked up, and their irrigation had been turned off, somewhere else. So, between the leaf litter, and 820 the lack of irrigation, it wasn't the shade from the trees, it wasn't the root growth, it was the fact that there were 821 too many leaves, too much acid sitting on the soil, not enough water getting watered. There was another spot, in 822 front of a house, further up, further south on Cat Brier, that was, is bulldozer blight and there's nothing you can 823 do. It's like the playground Buck Lane Park. So, I don't know if that's me. So, you can replace stuff there, but it 824 looks like the problem there is that people are just walking. I mean, they're literally just destroying whatever's 825 there, with either foot traffic, or I'm not sure exactly what's going on. But it's unlike what's elsewhere. It's clear 826 that the residents of that house are doing something, between the sidewalk and the curb, that is killing anything 827 you put there.

828

- 829 Spv. Berube: (00:25:02)
- 830 Well, beyond that, let's go to the other side of the road, on the golf course side. There are wide expanses where
- 831 the sod is really, really, really thin, it's almost non-existent, including the area where the big dig was, all along Cat
- 832 Brier. And I get it, with the residential side, if people want to beat up their sod, that's one thing. But the other
- side looks pretty bad, too. And there's not a whole lot of traffic over there. And we've been discussing that for a
- 834 long time, as well.
- So, in my opinion, the sod's not coming back. And it needs something done, whether we do it on the golf course side, and not the residence side, because people want to beat it up. I'm sure not everybody who lives there is beating up the sod. Some of it is just problematic. But I think we owe it to the residents for the golf course side to
- 838 get that sod looking good. I mean, that's just what they pay fees for. You know, so-
- 839 Spv. Kassel:
- 840 Well, we only visited certain sectors, where it was bad.
- 841 Spv. Berube:
- 842 Sure.
- 843 Spv. Kassel:
- 844 We didn't do the entire-
- 845 Spv. Berube:
- 846 Right.
- 847 Spv. Kassel:
- 848 block.
- 849 Spv. Berube:
- 850 But as you drive along, just look out on the golf course side, along Cat Brier, and you'll see what I'm talking about.
- 851 It's easier if you're walking or riding a bicycle, but in a car, you can still see it. It's not looking good.
- 852 Spv. Kassel:
- And it's not because there's a lot of leaf litter... Here comes Brett.
- 854 Spv. Berube:
- 855 No, they've pretty well cleaned it up.
- 856 Area Field Director Perez
- 857 And during that inspection we talked-
- 858 Spv. Kramer:
- 859 Area Field Director Perez.
- 860 Area Field Director Perez:

- 861 Sorry.
- 862 Spv. Kramer:
- 863 Sorry, I'm just letting the minutes taker know.
- 864 District Manager Montagna:
- 865 Yes.
- 866 Area Field Director Perez

B67 During our inspection, too, Pete verified that that side of Cat Brier, the golf course side, had irrigation that was shut off. That's since been kicked back on. So hopefully what we're seeing is that we're going to push some of that growth, with irrigation. It wasn't being irrigated. And I'm not 100% sure why. I think some of that was mainline breaks, some of that was-

- 871 Pete Betancourt:
- 872 Valves.
- 873 Spv. Berube:
- 874 It's in that area where that big break was. And they-
- 875 Area Field Director Perez
- 876 Correct.
- 877 Spv. Berube:
- 878 probably just shut it off to fix it.
- 879 Area Field Director Perez
- 880 That's been kicked back on to run. What I would suggest is, you're not going to see a real big push of growth right
- now, aside from weeds. So, keep the weeds out, keep the leaves out, push it with fertilizer, let's see where it's at
   June/July, and then, re-evaluate, would be my suggestion.
- 883 Scottie Feliciano:
- And I don't mind throwing in sod, at our cost.
- 885 Spv. Kassel:
- 886 We'll see how it goes.
- 887 Spv. Kramer:
- 888 It's nice to have you back.
- 889 Spv. Berube:
- 890 When you stand up and say things like that, we want you to come back next month. But, I mean, you know, it's
- iust a mess there, always.

- 892 Spv. Kramer:
- 893 Any other concerns or comments, at this point in time?
- 894 Spv. Berube:
- 895 I had a note, but I can't read it. Doesn't matter.
- 896 Kirk Allen
- 897 I got one thing on this-
- 898 Spv. Kramer:
- 899 Yes, sir.
- 900 Kirk Allen
- 901 if we put sod in, because I did, on Cat Brier, farther down towards the park.
- 902 Spv. Berube:
- 903 Oh, I know what it is now.
- 904 Kirk Allen
- 905 There, it, if it's-
- 906 Spv. Kassel:
- 907 Lakeshore Park?
- 908 Kirk Allen
- 909 so heavily shaded, and it doesn't get four hours, at least, of sunlight, the grass that was put in in Floratam, that's
- 910 for the full sun. You've probably heard that before. But it'd have to be a shade tolerant grass, because it still
- 911 needs, like, four to six hours of sunlight.
- 912 Spv. Kassel:
- 913 I live on Schoolhouse, by Pond Pine, and, you know, my oaks are, the oaks in that area are starting to get mature.
- 914 And if the grass is kept irrigated, and free of a lot of litter, and fertilized, and weed treated, so far, it seems to be
- 915 doing well. Now, maybe when the trees get another 10 years old, that grass isn't going to be able to handle that.
- 916 But for now, it seems to me that, in most areas, where there is bulldozer blight Sorry, that's what my husband
- 917 used to call it, which is essentially just over usage, or either people being irresponsible, or just not understanding.
- 918 It may be that, in 10 years, we have to do something about it. But I think, for now, in most places, it's a matter of
- 919 picking up the leaf litter, irrigating, like Brett said, fertilizing, et cetera.
- 920 Spv. Kramer:
- 921 All right. Well, thank you everybody.
- 922 Scottie Feliciano:
- 923 Thank you.

946	Okay. Does anybody know anything about They asked us to keep it on the agenda
947	Spv. Berube:
948	Table it.
949	Spv. Kramer:
950	to discuss it. Tim, do you know anything about this?
250	to discuss it. Airi, do you know drytning about this:
951	Tim Qualls
952 953	Thank you, Madame Chair. Just the email that was sent to everybody. And their position is that they've answered the questions that the Board addressed, so that the Board could make a decision.

- 954 Spv. Kramer:
- 955 All right.
- 956 Spv. Berube:
- 957 I vote guilty, that's my decision. Case closed. I mean, there's nobody here.
- 958 Spv. Kramer:

959 I'll just give you what information I know of. After the meeting in January, I contacted Jane Adams, who is the 960 supervisor of site planning. She was very concerned. They did not give her any heads up that they didn't have 961 ownership of all the property. I asked her about the multipurpose trail issue. She said that that could be moved 962 around, but what they had proposed, she was looking at while we spoke, she didn't feel was acceptable. She 963 immediately sent an email out to them, asking them to please contact her, as they should have let her know as 964 soon as there was a question as to ownership. The information they provided, again, seems straightforward. It 965 seems like they, the County is willing to allow them to move that multipurpose trail. I would like to have it from a 966 little higher source person in the County. The County Attorney, Tim, did you speak with them?

- 967 Tim Qualls
- 968 I did reach out to the County Attorney, but I haven't spoken with them. However, in the email that was sent, Mr.
- 969 Pratt says that the County would not object to the CDD conveying track B-1.
- 970 Spv. Kramer:

971 Right. That is in there. They indicated, let's see if I can read my small print here. This is from Natasha Billyer,

972 Assistant County Attorney, it says, "Good morning Mr. Pratt. As discussed, the county would not object to the

973 CDD conveying track B-1 to your client, but would reserve the right to require access onto/ from the property, as

974 it develops, consistent with applicable codes." Okay, so that seems like the County is saying that we can convey

- 975 it, or we can sell it to them. Is that your interpretation, Mr. Qualls?
- 976 Tim Qualls:

977 Yes. That, since it's the County that enforces the PUD, and they have apparently waived the requirement that a 978 utility tract must be owned by the CDD. Then, yes, I believe that's what the County has conveyed to Mr. Pratt.

979 Spv. Kramer:

980 I guess this is an email from Chavez, with the Planning Department, Planner 1, from Osceola County, said that,

that they can move the multi-use trail. So, it appears, at this time, that we, if the Board is interested, and if they

- are still interested, we could convey this to them, if they wanted. I will leave that open to any discussion.
- 983 Spv. Berube:

Well, I think we're potentially giving away public land, and getting an easement in return. The value of the land,
to the current residents of Harmony, is probably negligible. But the value of that same piece of land, to the guy
trying to convey it, is pretty high. And that's why there's this discussion going back and forth to try to sell it.

987 I don't have any reservation about conveying the land over. But I think we should get something, probably 988 something substantial, in return. Let's face it, there's millions of dollars changing hands over there. And, you 989 know, we should get something. And this landowner, I think, would be willing to give up a pretty substantial 990 amount of funding, and maybe other concessions, to get this done. And I think this is the time to get it and I

991 think, at the same time, we should ask this developer to be sure, like we have done with other developers, to be

- 992 sure that other standards are going to be sure that other standards are going to be met; playgrounds, various
- open area, all of that and with specificity, because let's face it, there's money on the table here. Probably some
- big money. If you want specifics of what I'm thinking of, we now know that the land that generated the lawsuit a
- 995 year or so ago probably is ours. So, the lawsuit was-
- 996 Spv. Kramer:
- 997 It is ours.
- 998 Spv. Berube:
- 999 So that lawsuit was, it was ridiculous at the least, stupid at the best. We-
- 1000 Spv. Kramer:
- 1001 I think we have people handling that. So, I don't know that you want to discuss it in an open meeting.
- 1002 Spv. Berube:
- 1003 Well, I'm just going to tell you what I think we should do because-
- 1004 Spv. Kramer:
- 1005 Okay. District Manager, you spoke with them.
- 1006 District Manager Montagna:
- 1007 Oh, insurance, yeah.
- 1008 We probably shouldn't discuss it.
- 1009 Spv. Kramer:
- 1010 Yes.
- 1011 District Manager Montagna:
- 1012 You can discuss what you want to do with the land, but I'm saying that particular issue.
- 1013 Spv. Kramer:
- 1014 The lawsuit.
- 1015 District Manager Montagna:
- 1016 Yeah, the lawsuit, I wouldn't say anything about that.
- 1017 Spv. Kramer:
- 1018 Right. Right.
- 1019 Spv. Berube:
- 1020 Well, okay. But it's related and it has to be. The lawsuit should be dropped.
- 1021 District Manager Montagna:



- 1022 Right.
- 1023 Spv. Berube:

And that landowner should pay back the cost of defense spent so far at a minimum. I was going to ask last month, ask for the same thing and get those lands back that we now know are ours. We probably could ask for other things, but we, the lawsuit's always been up here flopping about and his lawsuit, or whatever, but we should go for that. Ask him for it.

1028 Spv. Leet:

Placing the lawsuit issue aside on advice of our District Manager. I'm partial to the Cat Lake access. We know that this developer is, you know, has purchased that parcel going out to Cat Lake, so I'm agreeing with Steve, that there are concessions that it's only fair that we make sure we're getting for the benefit of our community.

1032 Spv. Kramer:

1033 So, what I'm hearing from the Board, and correct me if I'm wrong, that now that we've got all the questions

1034 answered about the CDD being able to sell it and not being held back from that from the County. The question of

1035 the multipurpose trail has been resolved that this Board would entertain some, an offer from the adjacent land

- 1036 owners if they wanted to purchase that property..
- 1037 Spv. Leet:
- 1038 Right. I think we're willing to convey it, but there should be something in it for us.
- 1039 Spv. Berube:
- 1040 Yeah. Shouldn't be a freebie.
- 1041 Spv. Kramer:

1042 Well, there's, there's definitely some value to it. I presume, now I haven't done the numbers, but, if we're still

1043 owning it and if they can still put driveways in, by way of the reserved rights, there's still a value to the land

- 1044 because it goes into the density calculations.
- 1045 Spv. Berube:
- 1046 Goes into the what calculations?
- 1047 Spv. Kramer:
- 1048 Density.
- 1049 Spv. Berube:
- 1050 Oh, okay.
- 1051 Spv. Kramer:

1052 So how many units they can actually have on that particular piece of property is based, I presume on the acreage

1053 of that piece of property. And if you take this piece out of it and keep it under our ownership, and that would

1054 reduce that maximum number. Now, whether they're at the maximum or not, I don't know.

#### 1055 Spv. Berube:

1056 I don't think it makes sense to grant them an easement and have us own it when somebody else is going to build

permanent improvements on something that we just hold an easement to. If we're going to convey it, we conveyit. And when we get that

1059 Spv. Kramer:

1060 Well, they would need to convey back an easement. And I'd want the wording on the easement to be pretty 1061 stringent, similar to the FGT easement.

- 1062 Spv. Berube:
- 1063 Sure.
- 1064 Spv. Kramer:
- 1065 Whereas if we have to go in and do maintenance, we're not obligated to repair it back to-
- 1066 Spv. Berube:
- 1067 Of course not.
- 1068 Spv. Kramer:

1069 it's full, but they would, we would do the repair, we would fill the hole in and they would put the parking lot and

- everything back in. So, that's where we're at. But since nobody's here with an ask right now, Mr. Qualls, do youhave anything else to contribute?
- 1072 Tim Qualls :

1073 No. I mean, it seems that the developer's position has changed. Last month they were willing to make certain 1074 concessions to get something done, including dropping the lawsuit that was specifically mentioned.

- 1075 This time they're just asking for the CDD to either keep the property or to convey the property.
- 1076 District Manager Montagna:
- 1077 Tim.
- 1078 Tim Qualls:
- 1079 And so obviously
- 1080 District Manager Montagna:
- 1081 Tim.
- 1082 Spv. Berube:
- 1083 Wasn't mentioned in public.
- 1084 Tim Qualls:

1085 Can't have a discussion without the other party here, but there is the document from the last month that talks 1086 about the specific request, you know, that they want.

#### 1087 District Manager Montagna:

1088 So, Tim, when was the request brought up? Because I don't ever recall them stating that they would make any 1089 concessions. Was that on the record somewhere? Because, I don't know how the Board could have even taken 1090 that into consideration if it was never proposed.

- 1091 Tim Qualls:
- 1092 Well, I believe what happened last month was that, that the discussion never got that far.
- 1093 Spv. Berube:
- 1094 Right.
- 1095 Tim Qualls:
- 1096 Because of the-
- 1097 District Manager Montagna:

1098 But it, and that's fine, but it's easy to go back and say, "We would've, could have done." But nothing was 1099 presented. I don't think that's a fair statement.

- 1100 Spv. Berube:
- 1101 I was going to bring that up, but we ended up with the questions over the appurtenant and gross easements and
- 1102 various other questions that the Chairwoman brought up. So rather get into it then, I figured why continue the
- discussion that had gone on for an hour, for another half an hour? Right? We knew we were going to table it, so I
- 1104 figured.
- 1105 Spv. Kassel:
- 1106 If you want to clear this up, what is it you propose to request?
- 1107 Spv. Berube:
- 1108 Dropping of the lawsuit, repayment of the-
- 1109 Spv. Kramer:
- 1110 It appears that it's going away anyway.
- 1111 Spv. Berube:
- 1112 It appears what?
- 1113 Spv. Kramer:
- 1114 That it's going away anyway without-
- 1115 Spv. Berube:
- 1116 Well, I understand.
- 1117 Spv. Kramer:



- 1118 I wouldn't use that as a...
- 1119 Spv. Berube:

But the problem is that it's probably going to go away, but we're not going to recollect the defense fees. So, we should make that part of the deal. The lawsuit was ridiculous, so just because it goes away, let's collect the

- 1122 defense.
- 1123 Spv. Kassel:
- 1124 What else did you have in mind?
- 1125 Spv. Berube:
- 1126 And I wanted to get back the parcels on both sides of the east entrance, which now Madam Chair says-
- 1127 Spv. Kramer:
- 1128 We already have.
- 1129 Spv. Berube:
- 1130 We own, but-
- 1131 Spv. Kassel:
- 1132 I would like to talk on that.
- 1133 Spv. Berube:
- 1134 We didn't at the time, we know now, but-
- 1135 Spv. Kramer:
- 1136 We did.
- 1137 Spv. Berube:
- 1138 So that's gone. So that's an ask. I would agree with Supervisor Leet to regain access to Cat Lake, easy access,
- 1139 rather than have a locked white fence. That's at a minimum and this is a minimum.
- 1140 Spv. Kramer:
- 1141 Now, you know, that's not owned by Mr. Fusilier anymore.
- 1142 Spv. Leet:
- Right. My understanding was this has already been purchased by the other party. So, whatever that means for how this gets negotiated or fits in. The negotiation needs to take place. At the end it's going to the same place.
- 1145 Spv. Kramer:
- 1146 It's owned by, I think the company's Harmony Clubhouse or something.
- 1147 Spv. Leet:

1148	Yeah.
1149	Spv. Kramer:
1150	It's a whole different owner that he sold to.
1151	Spv. Leet:
1152	Coastline Group down in South Florida.
1153	Spv. Berube:
1154 1155 1156	Well, we could ask for all kinds of other things, but those are a couple big ones, right? The recapture of the defense costs is a biggie. It's that simple. You've always said it. You want to figure out how to recapture that money. It's an ask. All they can do is say no, how else you going to get it back?
1157	Spv. Kramer:
1158 1159	I don't want to go into it because it involves our insurance. I don't want to tip their hand on what's going on. I would recommend not throwing that into the mix, so.
1160	Spv. Kassel:
1161	They can't really do anything with the Central Bark Dog park. I mean, it's not really developable into anything.
1162	Spv. Leet:
1163	Okay, that's not attached to that owner.
1164	Spv. Kassel:
1165	It is.
1166	The seller is the same.
1167	Spv. Leet:
1168	Yeah.
1169	Spv. Kramer:
1170	That is Compass Trading.
1171	Spv. Berube:
1172 1173	Yeah. It's Compass Trading. Backing up a second. If there's something going on with a lawsuit that has my name on it, be kind of nice to know.
1174	District Manager Montagna:
1175	There's nothing going on at all, except for the fact that, I have to produce some documents and then that's it.

- 1176 Spv. Kramer:
- 1177 Again, I think our attorney has asked us not to discuss lawsuits or what is willing or not willing.



1178	Spv. Berube:
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- 1179 This has nothing to do with the lawsuit. It has to do with recapturing the money that was spent.
- 1180 District Manager Montagna:
- 1181 On the lawsuit.
- 1182 Spv. Berube:
- 1183 Right. Separate.
- 1184 Spv. Kramer:
- 1185 All right. At this point in time, we have nobody here. That is-
- 1186 Spv. Berube:
- 1187 Table it-
- 1188 Spv. Kramer:

So again, we are willing to look at this now that our hands are free of the County's restrictions. So, if they would like to come back and make a proposal to the Board, we would more than welcome it and we would consider it. Any other, anything that needs to be delt on this issue since no one's here at this point in time, we will, until it's brought back up and it's of concern, then we'll just let it drop. So, we'll move on to the next item on the agenda, the consent agenda.

1257 1258	Spv. Berube: Can I ask you a question Madam District Manager while you're looking along?
1230	Can rask you a question Madam District Manager while you're looking along:
1259	District Manager Montagna:
1260	Sure.
1261	Spv. Berube:
1262 1263	It is pretty easy. Probably go over to Senior Perez over there too. Every month we get a nice investigation report, with lots of pictures, the monthly report. This month, there were 33 or 36 pictures or whatever.
1264	District Manager Montagna:
1265	Okay.
1266	Spv. Berube:
1260	I think the last time we saw was 92 pictures. Most of it centers around Servello. And I asked this question-
1269	
1268 1269	Spv. Kramer:
1209	That's further down on the agenda.
1270	Spv. Berube:



1271	Where?
1272 1273	District Manager Montagna: Field Report.
1274 1275	Spv. Kramer: Field report.
1276 1277	Spv. Berube: Well, I thought the DistrictManager did that.
1278 1279	District Manager Montagna: No, I do not.
1280 1281	Spv. Berube: Well, you know where I'm going so think about it when we get back in.
1282 1283	Spv. Kramer: All right. So, we'll go back to District Manager's report.
1284 1285	District Manager Yes.
1286 1287	Spv. Berube: What does the DistrictMmanager do when the field guy seems to do it all?
1288 1289	District Manager Montagna: I do nothing.
1290 1291	Spv. Berube: That's what he told me, too.
1292 1293	Spv. Kramer: You read a report. You see she's been doing a lot, so. But let her report on her actions.
1294 1295	Spv. Berube: She normally doesn't get enough time to speak at the meeting, so.
1296 1297 1298	District Manager Montagna: So, the Garden Club asked for a \$500 re-loadable card. That is not feasible. The reason for that is audit. When we get audited, we don't think we'll get a clean audit with a pre-loadable card.
1290	Spv. Kassel:

- 1300 So, what is the alternative?
- 1301 District Manager Montagna:

So, the alternative, what I suggested after talking to accounting and kind of seeing the process of how it goes is if they provide, because according to the resolution that counsel provided for the garden is whatever they bring in, they have to spend within that fiscal year. So, it would be easier or at least I think if they provided a list of supplies, they needed to Vincent. He has a Harmony card and let him purchase their supplies, let them use them.

1306 That way we can track, because when he turns in his receipts, we can say, okay, this \$300 was for the Garden 1307 Club and then we can track it like that. The other thing with re-loadable is unless I'm constantly talking to 1308 accounting and they're constantly talking to me that card could continually get reloaded. And then we could be 1309 out of sorts with the resolution versus what we should be doing. And we don't want to risk that either.

1310 Spv. Berube:

1311 To that point, I don't want to interrupt you but this is an important point. We've always had credit cards and

- 1312 we've always enjoyed tax free status, is the current credit cards still going through CDD and using the tax-free 1313 status.
- 1314 District Manager Montagna:
- 1315 So, he is using it yes. In every purchase that he makes, wherever it is, uses the CDD tax status.
- 1316 Spv. Berube:
- 1317 Well, that's a 7.5% gain for the Garden Club doing it that way, so.
- 1318 District Manager Montagna:
- 1319 Oh, and it would be the same because he would be purchasing in essence for the District, so.
- 1320 Spv. Kassel:
- 1321 Can I ask-
- 1322 District Manager Montagna:
- 1323 Yes.
- 1324 Spv. Kassel:
- 1325 Marilyn if that is feasible from her perspective?
- 1326 Marilyn Ash-Mower:

1327 I can see where situations arise that we will need something straight away. I would have to wait probably two or 1328 three days in order to get it, example of leak or something in the garden. What I've been doing now is spending 1329 my own money, sending in the receipts and getting reimbursed. I've been doing that, I don't know, 3, 4, 5 years 1330 now, that works for me if that'll work for you. Takes me 30 days to get my money, but oh, well.

1331 District Manager Montagna:

- 1332 It does, it is a process. And we were trying to cut that down. So maybe, perhaps if we did kind of a combination of
- both where if they have a running list of stuff, the timbers, the visqueen and stuff that you guys use on a normalbasis, that list goes to Vincent. He can get that on an as needed basis.
- 1335 Marilyn
- 1336 Okay.
- 1337 District Manager Montagna:
- 1338 If it's a one-off thing or something like that, you can continue to purchase it and then just send in your receipts.1339 Like you always have.
- 1340 Marilyn
- 1341 Okay.
- 1342 District Manager Montagna:
- 1343 If that's amenable to the board.
- 1344 Spv. Kramer:
- Yeah, it works for me. But I wanted to ask a question. Last time I saw we have quite a few plumbing and irrigationpieces and parts in that trailer. Can-
- 1347 Spv. Berube:
- 1348 Probably don't need to buy any.
- 1349 Spv. Kramer:
- 1350 The Garden folks could just get what they needed for that. Is that doable?
- 1351 Area Field Director Perez:
- 1352 I just asked Vincent that?
- 1353 Marilyn

1354 Well, the last time I asked about irrigation, which I wound up doing myself with the help of two other gardeners,

- 1355 was that nobody on staff knew how to do the irrigation. So, I did it myself.
- 1356 Spv. Berube:
- 1357 I think that's changed.
- 1358 Area Field Director Perez:
- 1359 Yeah. So, Area Field Director Perez,-
- 1360 Marilyn
- 1361 Being self-employed all my life, if something needs to be done, I do it.
- 1362 Area Field Director Perez:



1363	No, you're fine.
1364	We do have irrigation parts on hand.
1365	Marilyn
1366	Okay.
1367	Area Field Director Perez:
1368	So even if it's something that the Garden Club wants to do, like an irrigation repair, we can check with Vincent to
1369	see
1370	if those parts are in stock already.
1371 1372	And then give them to you, so you don't have to go out and purchase them. And all of a sudden, now you wait 30 days for an 85 cent elbow.
1373	Marilyn
1374	Right.
1375	Area Field Director Perez:
1376	Right. So, we do have some on hand. Now when we run low, we can always, we can always run to ACE or Home
1377	Depot or Site One, and-
1378	Marilyn
1379	Hmm. Awesome.
1380	Spv. Kassel:
1381	What about making the repairs?
1382	Spv. Berube:
1383	We can do the repairs, still.
1384	Area Field Director Perez:
1385	We can do the repairs. So, if it's the repairs inside the plot, though-
1386	Spv. Kramer:
1387	Yeah.
1388	Area Field Director Perez:
1389	That would fall to it.
1390	Spv. Kramer:
1391	The parts should not go inside the plot.
1392	Area Field Director Perez:
1393	Right.



- 1394 Spv. Kramer:
- 1395 These are strictly up to and through the spigot.
- 1396 Marilyn
- 1397 Well, this one was, there were two plots, which the developer put in to make the garden look attractive. And we
- still use one for flowers. One, we turned into a vegetable garden and the irrigation went straight through the endof that right across the plot.
- 1400 Spv. Kramer:
- 1401 That has not been fixed yet. I thought that was in our list to be fixed already.
- 1402 Marilyn
- 1403 That was what?
- 1404 Spv. Kramer:
- 1405 On our list to have that rerouted already.
- 1406 Marilyn
- 1407 Yeah, I did.
- 1408 Spv. Kramer:
- 1409 That's the one she did.
- 1410 Marilyn
- 1411 Yeah, I think so-
- 1412 Area Field Director Perez:
- 1413 That was supposed to be Servello.
- 1414 Marilyn

1415 But that was because the tiller keeps breaking it and we keep having a problem. So, it's now taken care of. It's

- 1416 around the bed and then continues on wherever it goes, which I had no idea where it goes.
- 1417 Spv. Berube:

1418 So, the simple fix for the irrigation stuff is to check with Vincent. We've got plenty of stuff in the trailer. If we 1419 don't have it.

- 1420 Marilyn
- 1421 Yeah.
- 1422 Spv. Berube:
- 1423 Then we get it. You can get it. We can get it.

- 1424 Area Field Director Perez:
- 1425 Yeah. It's fine. Again, change in management, sometimes that stuff is a learning process for him as well as myself.
- As long as the parts for the repairs are outside the plots is the biggest thing we just got to make sure. If it's inside, obviously that falls to the, to the renters.
- 1428 Marilyn
- 1429 I don't know if that's, no, that's the problem.
- 1430 Area Field Director Perez:
- 1431 Correct.
- 1432 Marilyn
- 1433 Yeah.
- 1434 Spv. Kramer:
- 1435 There we go.
- 1436 District Manager Montagna:
- 1437 So, we're clear if they need ongoing supplies, they'll provide that list to Vincent and you can have one of the guys
- run out or you whomever. And then if it's one-off things you'll still get reimbursed like you always have.
- 1439 Marilyn
- 1440 Okay. Okay.
- 1441 District Manager Montagna:
- 1442 Is that good?
- 1443 Marilyn
- 1444 That's good. I'd just like a verification to see if my numbers are the same as what you have. And I put that on my 1445 last expense sheet that I submitted.
- 1446 District Manager Montagna:
- 1447 Oh, okay. I can get that report out to you in the morning.
- 1448 Marilyn
- 1449 Yeah. Just to verify, I'm not over.

- 1474 The issue is the guy in California, I forget his name, but he-
- 1475 District Manager Montagna:

1476 Okay. So regardless you're going to be getting a test email probably in the next three days, we supposedly have

- 1477 the bug worked out, whatever the issue was. And you'll get a test email, it'll tell you to respond to it, respond to it 1478 and just say yes or whatever. And then you'll get an email to reset a password.

- 1480 If we don't get it, how do we respond yes?
- 1481 District Manager Montagna:
- 1482 You let me know that you did not get it.

- 1486 I know, I'm going to send out an email.
- 1487 Spv. Kassel:
- 1488 But I have to say, we've heard, we're going to be getting an email in three days.
- 1489 Spv. Kramer:
- 1490 I remember that. (laughs)
- 1491 District Manager Montagna:
- 1492 Actually, it was seven days and I said, you'll get it in three.
- 1493 Spv. Kramer:
- 1494 Okay.
- 1495 District Manager Montagna:
- 1496 And here we are, 31 days later.
- 1497 Spv. Berube:
- 1498 It's close. With GoDaddy, that's pretty close.
- 1499 District Manager Montagna:
- 1500 So, the other thing I wanted to ask, I don't know if Tim is still on.
- 1501 Spv. Berube:
- 1502 He's up there.
- 1503 District Manager Montagna:

1504 But so we're going through the audits right now, obviously, for last year. Tim, I know one of the audit questions 1505 was you are on a flat fee as we have some other attorneys in different districts on flat fees, totally fine. Is there 1506 any way that when we get the invoice from Qualls and Young, if you, if it can be lined out with, it'll still show your 1507 flat fee, but just lined out, like maybe with the work or whatever is your billable hours? They had a question of, 1508 well, this really doesn't tell us what is being done and so we've had to go back to four different firms and ask if 1509 they would line it out. Is that something your office can do? I know you used to do it. I went back in all of y'all's 1510 invoices and you used to do it. - 1517 Okay, perfect. Field Report. Does the Board need to see all the items that are in there daily? Do you just want
- 1518 project-based items? For example, sidewalks, bullet dates, landscapes, not sure that we want all of it in there, so.
- 1519 Spv. Berube:
- 1520 You mean that thing that we get with all the pictures and the detail of work and all that?
- 1521 District Manager Montagna:
- 1522 Yep.
- 1523 Spv. Kassel:
- 1524 I find it confusing, frankly, because the pictures are so small that it's very hard to see anything.
- 1525 Spv. Berube:
- 1526 Trying to line up the words to the pictures is-
- 1527 Spv. Kramer:
- Yeah. And the day to day, I assume I'll hear about itif you don't empty the trash cans and fill the dog potty things.And so, the day to day stuff-
- 1530 District Manager Montagna:
- 1531 So, do you want to see anything? Do you want a report, do you not want a report? I mean, what are you looking 1532 for?
- 1533 Spv. Berube:
- 1534 I'm happy with the monthly report that we're going to discuss here in a few minutes.
- 1535 District Manager Montagna:
- 1536 That's in there.
- 1537 Spv. Berube:
- 1538 I know.
- 1539 District Manager Montagna:
- 1540 That's what I'm talking about.
- 1541 Spv. Berube:
- 1542 No, I'm talking about, we get one every week.
- 1543 District Manager Montagna:
- 1544 Oh, you don't want the weekly's.
- 1545 Spv. Berube:
- 1546 Right.



1547 1548	District Manager Montagna: Okay.
1549	Spv. Berube:
1550	Because the pictures are tiny, and.
1551	District Manager Montagna:
1552	Oh, I'm talking about the monthly report.
1553	Spv. Berube:
1554 1555	It's just routine stuff. You know, I appreciate the fact I've eventually went in and fixed the valves on the toilet and put batteries in the faucet.
1556	District Manager Montagna:
1557 1558	I'll close out the weekly. You won't get those, but the monthly that's in your agenda, you still want to continue to get that?
1559	Spv. Berube:
1560	Yeah, oh, yeah, yeah, that's-
1561	Spv. Kramer:
1562	The day to day -
1563	District Manager Montagna:
1564	The day to day, you said you don't want. Just the inspections?
1565	Spv. Kramer:
1566 1567	Well, if there's, I'm more interested in hearing the larger projects you're doing. The things that we may not ever know about, like the broken sewer pipe and like the bath houses. I'd like to know that those things are going on.
1568	Spv. Berube:
1569	Where are we with sidewalks and broken benches, vandalism.
1570	District Manager Montagna:
1571	You still want to see the landscape stuff?
1572	Spv. Kassel:
1573	Yeah.
1574	Spv. Berube:
1575	Oh yeah.
1576	District Manager Montagna:



1577	Okay.
1578	Spv. Berube:
1579	Oh yeah. That's the big one.
1580	District Manager Montagna:
1581	Okay. So just not the day-to-day stuff.

1623	Invoices, I know there's still some Avid training going on, if everybody's done with it, I don't know.

1627	that month, that invoices we were going to be approving rather than everything. Right? She said she was going to
1628	send something and I never got anything.
1629	District Manager Montagna:
1630	You can, we can literally create and you as a supervisor, you can create any report you want, you can create-

- 1631 Spv. Kassel:
- 1632 Well, she said, when I was going through the training with her, she said no, there wasn't a way-
- 1633 District Manager Montagna:
- 1634 For you to do it?
- 1635 Spv. Kassel:

1636 Yeah. So, she would have to do it on the back end. Okay. But there was a way that she could do it. That was fairly

1637 quick and it doesn't take three hours. I never saw a sample. She never got back to-



- 1638 District Manager Montagna:
- 1639 All right. I'll talk to her.
- 1640 Area Field Director Perez:
- 1641 There may be a permission angle.
- 1642 District Manager Montagna:

Right. And that's what she said. It would be different permissions based off of what you wanted to see and all that. So, I'll have her send something out and then we can talk about, again, it's nothing pressing. District owned land. Staff is reviewing and researching that within Harmony. I know Elizabeth worked, she got some stuff changed with the property appraiser's office. We're also looking into the parcel across from the school and Cat Lake access parcel, why they haven't paid CDD assessments. So, she's trying to piece that together. Gary Moyer initially was here from inception. She's actually going to have a call with Gary and see if he can kind of help her piece some of that together. And what happened? He was actually the one here.

- 1650 Spv. Kassel:
- 1651 Right. And the dog park, too Central Bark.
- 1652 District Manager Montagna:
- 1653 Okay. That one too? I think I have that on parcel id map. I just don't recognize it Central-
- 1654 Spv. Kramer:
- 1655 That's not a separate parcel though. That's a-
- 1656 Spv. Berube:
- 1657 It's part of another big-
- 1658 Spv. Kramer:
- 1659 part of a big parcel that is platted.
- 1660 District Manager Montagna:
- 1661 It's part of the other one Teresa?
- 1662 Spv. Berube:
- 1663 Yes. It through heads out towards 192, the-
- 1664 Spv. Kramer:
- 1665 Yeah. When we finish I'll pull it up and show it to you.
- 1666 District Manager Montagna:

1667 Okay. So, all we're looking into all that and hopefully I'll have a report in your next agenda with all that stuff. 1668 Invasive, invasive species. I know you guys have talked about this ad nauseum, I'm sure over the years, but as we 1669 did the inspection, there's a lot out there. It's a big area, your current staff, it wouldn't matter if you had 20 1670 people to do it. It's just not going to make a dent in it. So again, whatever the Board decides to do, but I have

- 1671 reached out and started getting some proposals to do it like a onetime hit thing and then your staff can keep up
- with it directly after. Whether you choose to move forward. That obviously, is up to you, but I am in the middle ofgetting proposals for that. So, I just wanted to let you know.
- 1674 Spv. Berube:

1675 I have a question regarding that. Are we getting dunning notices or anything from South Florida Water 1676 Management District that we're not treating to their timetable, or you are just looking ahead thinking maybe we 1677 will?

- 1678 District Manager Montagna:
- 1679 Yes.
- 1680 Spv. Kramer:

1681 What you're looking at and what we saw is that there are a lot of places, and Katherine addressed this at the last 1682 meeting, where the vine is right at the crown of the tree. And once it over tops that tree, it will kill it.

- 1683 Spv. Berube:
- 1684 Sure.
- 1685 Spv. Kramer:

And not only that, but it's a fire ladder and the reports are now until middle of March. We're not going to have any rain at all and we're going to be in the high 80s and low 90s. Fire is a serious concern. She was also recommending that sooner than later, that we get more personnel or a management company to come in here and do it.

1690 District Manager Montagna:

1691 And there, there's all different ways you can do it. I've done it in several other districts, it's a huge expense and

1692 not a lot of districts have the money to go out and hit that all at once. So, what they've done is kind of chopped it

1693 up. We're budgeting X amount this year, they get that done, your staff comes in behind them. Then they move on

1694 the next year to the next section. There are all different ways to do it, but at some point it's going to have to be

- 1695 gotten under control and to be able to be maintained.
- 1696 Spv. Berube:

1697 I understand that, I'm not arguing that point. The problem is you can go bankrupt really quickly trying to kill this 1698 green weed. There are limits to what you can do financially.

1699 Spv. Kramer:

Well, I'm going to throw out some ballpark numbers just for you guys to think about over the next month between two and \$300,000, I think around that ballpark will get us teams of people that will go in and on all of the conservation areas that we actually own, they will do three sweeps through, at different times of the year, basically annihilating, not only the old world climbing firm, but the Cogon grasss and the Brazilian Pepper. And, they will take it down and guarantee, I think one of the firms, to the 90% kill rate.

- 1705 District Manager Montagna:
- 1706 They usually...

### 1707 Spv. Kramer:

1708 And at that point, our staff can then be doing it, inspecting. Because, you could go out there in areas that have

1709 never had it before, or that have been treated and the little guys are just popping up all over the place. Now our

- 1710 staff can get in there and do that, because there's no cutting involved, it's strictly an application, but the cutting, 1711 getting into the wet areas that are heavily wet, it just, without an army of people, it's not going to happen.
- 1/11 getting into the wet areas that are neavily wet, it just, without an army of people, it's not going to happe
- 1712 District Manager Montagna:
- 1713 It's, yeah. You just can't make a dent in it.
- 1714 Spv. Berube:
- 1715 Well, that number is that's pretty accurate because it was.
- 1716 Spv. Kassel:
- 1717 Because we got a quote for two, for a quarter of a million dollars.
- 1718 Spv. Berube:
- 1719 Yeah. \$263k and it was three, our years ago and that was on the five transects.
- 1720 Spv. Kramer:
- 1721 That was only a small amount.
- 1722 Spv. Berube:
- 1723 I know, I get it.
- 1724 Spv. Kramer:
- 1725 They'll do all of the stuff we own.
- 1726 Spv. Berube:
- 1727 Okay. That's why we went to what we did and assigned a couple three people to it.
- 1728 Spv. Leet:
- 1729 Right. They'll guarantee that.
- 1730 Spv. Berube:
- 1731 It's growing.
- 1732 District Manager Montagna:
- 1733 It depends. I mean, a lot of them will do like, well we guarantee a 80 to a 90% kill rate. I mean, it's going to come1734 back, obviously.
- 1735 Spv. Leet:
- 1736 Yeah.



- 1737 Spv. Kramer:
- 1738 After that, we still need our staff here-
- 1739 Spv. Kassel:
- 1740 To continue to main-
- 1741 Spv. Berube:
- 1742 Maintain it.
- 1743 Spv. Kramer:

1744 To continue to maintain it. But it's getting over that hump of the huge vines. I mean, they're massive. It was really 1745 humbling to see what this stuff was doing.

1746 Spv. Berube:

1747 And it's astounding to see how it's changed in a couple three years. The amount of area we treated, because you

1748 can tell, because it's dead and brown versus how much new green growth there is, it's overwhelming. This is

another one of those things from the state, an unfunded mandate you must take care of and no we're not going

- 1750 to pay. Great.
- 1751 District Manager Montagna:

1752 We'll get that into your March agenda. We should be ready. You can at least look at them and kind of see. Next, I

- 1753 wanted to go over agendas. Reports, proposals, additions, and or requests are due by Monday, at the latest,
- before the agenda goes out. So, your meeting is today, your agenda should have gone out Thursday by 6:00 PM.
- 1755 That's kind of in your-
- 1756 Spv. Kramer:
- 1757 With the whole pack.
- 1758 District Manager Montagna:

1759 your documents, right. The whole finished product out the door. So, we need to make sure we're getting reports,

- 1760 everything, also I'm not telling, I'm just saying a blanket statement.
- 1761 Spv. Kramer:

1762 And the way I remember it is, it's 10 days in advance. So, if we're meeting on the 24th, the 14th is the date I got 1763 to have everything in.

- 1764 District Manager Montagna:
- 1765 Correct.
- 1766 Spv. Kramer:
- 1767 To our DistrictMmanager.
- 1768 District Manager Montagna:

1769 And I mean, barring any emergencies, there will be times if y'all were going through something or if we were

- 1770 waiting a last minute on something, but you would be aware of it and it would be fine. Toho, OUC, ignore what I
- 1771 sent you. That is not, we have it broken out now by meter. I mean, it's not in information. It wasn't just what the
- 1772 Board had requested, which you wanted it broken down by meter cost, month, year over year. So now we've
- 1773 gone back and we're adding in the meters and all of that to each individual address.
- 1774 Spv. Kramer:
- 1775 Yeah, and that's the way it was... That's correct. It's presented each month. So, I presume you could just put all 1776 those together.
- 1777 District Manager Montagna

1778 Correct. All we're doing is combining it. The only thing that Sally typically was not doing was adding the meters 1779 in. She would do the account number, the address and the cost.

1780 Spv. Kramer:

1781 I don't know if anybody else needs a meter number, but I can look at the bill. If there's something that looks out

1782 of line, that's the only time I would look at it, so.

1783 District Manager Montagna:

1784 We already have it going in. So, you're going to have the date, the address, the meter, the cost. And then it'll be 1785 year over year. So, you'll have that moving forward.

1786 Spv. Berube:

1787 I sent you an email about some missing months. Didn't hear anything back, but there were at least three months 1788 missing. On both OUC and Toho and they were not the same months. Because you know, every month you get 1789 one, January, every month. And I looked at it and it was obvious that there was some missing there. And I said, 1790 "Well, okay." Then I said, "Well, let go look at the OUC." I looked at Toho. I went back and looked at the OUC and 1791 it was the same way. There was some, probably clerical, but you know, we get a bill every month, so.

- 1792 District Manager Montagna:
- 1793 Yeah. But that was on the one I sent out. Right? Not the one that Sally sends.
- 1794 Spv. Berube:
- 1795 Yes, sure.
- 1796 District Manager Montagna:
- Yeah. The one Sally sends is not missing any, the one that I sent out, that one's probably the one you're referringto.
- 1799 Spv. Berube:
- 1800 Yeah. Okay.
- 1801 District Manager Montagna:
- 1802 But I'll look at your email and then I'll let you know. Other than that, that is all I have. Unless you have something
- 1803 for me and I'm happy to address it.

#### 1804 Spv. Kramer:

1805 I would like, it would help me, being a relatively new Board member, to get kind of a breakdown of when we start 1806 heading into our budgeting time period. There are some deadlines that have to be met so-

- 1807 District Manager Montagna:
- 1808 For what?
- 1809 Spv. Kramer:
- 1810 For the budget.
- 1811 District Manager Montagna:
- 1812 Yeah. Like June 14 for the approval of your proposed budget.
- 1813 Spv. Kramer:

1814 So, if we were, God forbid, we have to, but we have a reserve study, we're still waiting on the final on. If we were

- 1815 to have to tweak our rates, when is the drop date for that?
- 1816 District Manager Montagna:

1817 Okay. I was going to go over this, so thank you for reminding me, the budget process. So, we're going into it. 1818 They're building yours right now. I do it a little bit different than probably your past managers have done it. What 1819 I do is I will go in and put everything in that needs to be in for that fiscal year based off of contracts, trending, 1820 spending, any projects that you guys talk about, I will put in all real numbers and I'm not going to tie it to your 1821 excess cash or anything. That's going to be actual real numbers. It will be tied to your assessment chart to where, 1822 when we come, and my plan is to come in March or April, depending on what you decide and start going through 1823 that. I'll send it out ahead of time so everybody can kind of look at it and then we can come and it will be a live 1824 document that we can kind of start messing with. If you're going to, whatever you're going to do, the deadline for 1825 that is June 15th to do the proposed. And typically, if you're going to raise assessments, that is the time that you 1826 do it because we have to send out letters and it has to be to county by June 15th. Now between June 15th and 1827 September 30th, we can, every meeting or workshop, whatever we want to do, we can start cutting that down. 1828 So, let's say-

- 1829 Spv. Kramer:
- 1830 But you can't increase it.
- 1831 District Manager Montagna:

Correct. The only thing you cannot do is increase it. So let's say we want to raise assessments. We say at the proposed \$10, right? And we're at that \$10 mark. And then we start talking and the board decides, well, let's not do 10. Let's do like \$3 and 50 cents and we can cut it down. The only thing you cannot do after June 15th is raise it higher than what it was set at June 15th. Okay? So that's kind of the process. I don't know, who's interested. I

- 1836 know some Board members like to see this kind of stuff and partake in it and some don't.
- 1837 Spv. Kassel:
- 1838 We always have.
- 1839 District Manager Montagna:

- 1840 Okay, perfect.
- 1841 Spv. Kassel:

1842 The Board always has started looking at it early, spending time in the meetings, going through line by line.

- 1843 Getting you adjustments to make. After, at the end of the discussion of each line item and then reviewing it again1844 at the next meeting.
- 1845 Spv. Berube:
- 1846 You put the last four or five years in there, right?
- 1847 District Manager Montagna:

1848 I think they go back, like, let's say we're going to 23, so they'll probably go back to eighteen, 19, 20, 21, or maybe 1849 19. I think they only go back like four years. They put on the document itself. So, what I'll do, if, if everybody's on 1850 board with it, I initially get all those numbers. I fill them in and I put notes on the side of where I got those 1851 numbers and why I came up with those numbers and then I can send everybody the spreadsheet and then you 1852 can kind of start moving stuff and playing with it yourself. And then when we come to the meeting, we can start, 1853 we can kind of start going through it. So, would you prefer that in your April meeting or you want to start it in

- 1854 your March meeting?
- 1855 Spv. Kassel:
- 1856 I would say March.
- 1857 District Manager Montagna:
- 1858 March?
- 1859 Spv. Kramer:
- 1860 The earlier the better and the other question that goes along with that is the reserve study. Where is that thing?
- 1861 Spv. Kassel:
- 1862 And are we going to have to have it adjusted because of the cost for-
- 1863 Spv. Kramer:
- 1864 Everything.
- 1865 Spv. Kassel:
- 1866 Resurfacing, and you know, pipes...
- 1867 District Manager Montagna:
- 1868 Were there any adjustments that needed to be made to that? Besides the ones that have already been 1869 submitted?
- 1870 Spv. Kramer:
- 1871 I submitted, streetlights. We forgot streetlights.



1872 1873	Spv. Leet: Streetlights?
1873	Spv. Kassel:
1875	What do you mean?
1876	Spv. Kramer:
1877	We have to replace our streetlights somewhere down the line.
1878	Spv. Berube:
1879	They're OUC's problem.
1880	Spv. Kramer:
1881	I thought we bought them.
1882	Spv. Berube:
1883	We paid off the capital lease, but they remain OUC's property.
1884	Spv. Kramer:
1885	Right. But aren't we going to have to start paying a lease fee again, if they have to replace them?
1006	
1886 1887	Spv. Berube: It's part of the maintenance. If a light If a car runs into it.
1888	Spv. Kassel:
1889	Why don't we have our District Manager look into it.
1890	Spv. Berube:
1891	OUC pays.
1892	District Manager Montagna:
1893	I'll pull the contract and look at it.
1894	Spv. Kassel:
1895	Take a look at it. I was under the same impression as Supervisor Berube, that the maintenance,
1896	District Manager Montagna:
1890	I never understood. I mean, every district leases
1898	Spv. Kramer:
1899	OUC doesn't understand the lease
1900	District Manager Montagna:

- 1901 I've never seen anywhere where the district would own them after the lease is up. Um, but that could be, there
- 1902 could have been a deal made there. I don't know, but I'll pull the contract and I'll find out, no problem. I'll also
- 1903 look into the streetlights, after that with the reserve study, I'll get with you David and see if there's anything else
- 1904 we need to add. If not, that, it should be final with the last changes that Teresa sent in.
- 1905 Spv. Kramer:
- 1906 I'm hoping he was looking at the cost because again, his cost for paving Alley C1 and 2...
- 1907 Spv. Kassel
- 1908 Was way lower.
- 1909 Spv. Kramer:
- 1910 Was way low than what, you know...
- 1911 Spv. Berube:
- 1912 Because the scope of work that the engineer put in for the paving for the alleys, was far more in depth than what
- 1913 the reserve study would be. The reserve study guy is going to look at it and total up the square feet. How much
- 1914 per square foot or square yard of pavement. And that's your number.
- 1915 Spv. Kassel:
- 1916 Yeah. What was that? Like \$150,000 versus like \$500,000.
- 1917 David Hamstra:
- 1918 All right. I'll go with Angel on that.
- 1919 Spv. Berube:
- 1920 You're talking two different, scopes of work here and no drainage improvements, none of that, it's separate. It's 1921 warm in here.
- 1922 District Manager Montagna:
- 1923 It's very warm in here.
- 1924 Spv. Kassel:
- 1925 It's so comfortable in here.
- 1926 Spv. Berube:
- 1927 To your point about this year's budget. I think Madam Chairwoman asked, what was his name? Steven? In the,...
- 1928 Spv. Kassel:
- 1929 Steve.
- 1930 Spv. Berube:
- 1931 And he said the budget, the reserve study that we're doing is going to take effect with your 2023 budget



- 1932 Spv. Kassel:
- 1933 But here's the thing.
- 1934 Spv. Berube:
- 1935 Next fiscal year.
- 1936 District Manager Montagna:
- 1937 23.
- 1938 Spv. Kassel:

But that's taking into consideration what we have and assumptions about what we're spending versus what we already have now. So, in other words, when we start that reserve study and we spend what we're planning on

- already have now. So, in other words, when we start that reserve study and we spend what we're planning on spending, that reserve study is saying, oh, but you're only spending this much, but we're spending this much.
- 1942 Spv. Kramer:
- 1943 So, we have to look at it.
- 1944 Spv. Berube:

1945 Yeah. You got to look at what your budget is versus the reserve study and your anticipated spending and kind of

- 1946 grind that all together from now 'til October and figure out what you want to do for this period. Because right
- now we're in limbo. We have a study. We don't have a budget. We have a new budget coming up and finishing a

- 1950 That's why I want all those pieces together.
- 1951 District Manager Montagna:
- 1952 David, we'll sync up on the reserve study and make sure we got our numbers in there correctly. Then we'll1953 present it.

- 1955 Sounds good. All right. It's about to get warmer under here in a few minutes.

- 1957 Nothing else for me, right?
- 1958 Spv. Kramer:

- 1965 David Hamstra:

1966 Good evening. David Hamstra for the record. Let me start off with Garden Road. A week ago today we released 1967 the bid documents to five contractors. Three of them had acknowledged receipt. I have not heard from the other 1968 two yet. Jr Davis was one of them, since they're already out there doing the water line and did, they did respond 1969 quickly saying they got the package, and we'll look at it. So, we are giving them until March 17th to submit 1970 comments to questions to us. The bids are due the following Thursday of March 24th. Gives us a week to look at 1971 them and then make a recommendation for award at your March 31st CDD meeting. So. That is tracking well so 1972 far. The Estates. We had Atlantic Pipe Services do all but one pipe and inlet. Turns out there's a tree growing 1973 inside.

- 1974 Spv. Kramer:
- 1975 Oh, do we have that picture?
- 1976 David Hamstra:
- 1977 That was a pretty impressive...
- 1978 District Manager Montagna:
- 1979 It was.
- 1980 Spv. Kramer:
- 1981 [crosstalk 01:18:48] I think everybody needs to see this.
- 1982 David Hamstra:
- 1983 Look Like a science fiction movie.
- 1984 Spv. Kramer:

1985 Yeah. And this again is why you'll hear me harp about, we need to inspect our storm water systems and make 1986 sure that our inlets and outflows and everything are properly being maintained, because without the proper

- 1987 maintenance, this is what we end up getting. So...
- 1988 Spv. Kassel:
- 1989 So, you said they did all pipes except for one?
- 1990 David Hamstra

The one they had the tree growing. So, they said they would come back. So, Vincent and Brett and staff went in there and removed this growth from the inlet and tree and APS, Atlantic Pipe Services, will come back out, do that inlet, that pipe, along with the 12 videos I got already from the other pipes. And by next Board meeting, I'll give you a complete accounting of what the condition is. I did drive through Estates this evening, when I went got here. I noticed you got one really bad area that the road is subsiding. I mean, significantly by two or three inches. My hunch is that pipe is compromised, but that's within the right of way. So that should be a County fix, not a

- 1997 CDD fix. So, I took a picture and I'll send it to Road and Bridge at the County.

1999	And that's in the Estate also?
2000	David Hamstra
2001	Yes.
2002	Spv. Berube:
2003	One thing for sure, with the tree growing in it, you were sure there was standing water in that pipe.
2004	Spv. Kramer:
2005	There you go right there. That is not a bale of hay. That is the root ball.
2006	Spv. Berube:
2007	That pipe is full of water and helping the tree. So, it was time to suck out the pipes.
2008	Spv. Kassel:
2009	Speaking of sucking out pipes, I know that drain by, between the dog parks has been clogged.
2010	Area Field Director Perez:
2011	Yeah.
2012	Spv. Kassel:
2013	Are they going to get to that?
2014	Area Field Director Perez:
2015	It's in my report.
2016	Spv. Kassel:
2017	Look into that?
2018	Spv. Kramer:
2019	Yeah. They'll get to it.
2020	Spv. Kramer:
2021	Okay.
2022	Spv. Berube:
2023	That's going to come back to haunt you.

2025 Neighborhood C1, C2. After wereceive the bids on Garden Road in a couple weeks, we were going to release this

2037	Yes ma'am.

2039	For the paving of the alley ways, what is our statutory requirement when we have to go to public bid?

2041	The threshold amount, I'll find that out for you. Let me look it up. I think it's Category 4, which is pretty high, but

Well, we've changed that a lot, because of meeting other 2081 fences, site surveys have changed things. We found the encroachment on-

- 2082 David Hamstra
- 2083 The wetland buffer areas.
- 2084 Spv. Berube:

Right. So, the, the way it's going to go in is changed. And then we got that whole front line, the front crossing where the gates are going to be, and that wasn't anticipated originally.

- 2087 Spv. Kramer:
- 2088 Okay. So, it's not a situation where we can use the old contract for the bulk of it and then...
- 2089 Spv. Berube:
- 2090 Piece it in?
- 2091 Spv. Kramer:

- 2092 Piece the other one in, because I just don't want to see things skyrocketing. Especially when he claims to have 2093 already purchased the material and having been stored on site.
- 2094 Spv. Berube:

2095 The question was, can we use everything that you've already bought and the current plan covers that. There will

- 2096 be no waste of anything already purchased, but the total labor and the amount of needed additional fence is still
- 2097 going to be over and above what that original contract is. I'm going to bet that we're going to add 7 or 8 or
- 2098 \$9,000 to what's already out there.
- 2099 Spv. Kramer:
- 2100 To the already \$17.6k or so.
- 2101 Spv. Berube
- 2102 \$ \$18.8k, I think it was.
- 2103 Yeah.
- $2104 \qquad \text{And half of that's already paid. Right?}$
- 2105 Yeah. \$17.6k, right. \$8,800, that's already paid, but you're going to have some big expenses because now we got
- to come around, cover up and you know, come to the front of the Conex's we're going to have two significant
- 2107 gates there and then you got to decide what you want with the gates. I think Mr. Hamstra has it set up for
- swinging gates.
- 2109 David Hamstra:
- $2110 \qquad \text{Believe so. I got to check with Greg.}$
- 2111 Spv. Berube:

2112 That could change to electric gates. Don't know or not. We're not quite at that point, you got to get the site plan

2113 finished. So, and then once the fence is done, now we're going to talk to the landscaping because we got to

2114 buffer all that from sight lines. The important thing is that we're going to be able to use the fence that's there and

- we're going to have to modify that contract. And that's going to require a little bit of thumb pressing I believe.
- 2116 But we got to get to that point.
- 2117 Spv. Kramer:
- 2118 Let's see what we can do with the existing, if there's any way to do portion of the existing and then do an add-on.
- 2119 Spv. Berube:
- 2120  $\,$  We're not going to throw away very much, if any of the existing fence.
- 2121 David Hamstra
- 2122 No, we'll be able to use it all.
- 2123 Spv. Berube:
- $2124 \qquad \hbox{Good. So that's one section that's going to be more.}$
- 2125 Spv. Kramer:



- 2126 Right. But again, I don't want him to come back. He bought it already at an existing price and then charge us the
- 2127 current going rate for the fencing.
- 2128 Spv. Berube:
- 2129 I suspect he hasn't purchased anything.
- 2130 Spv. Kramer:
- He says he has.
- 2132 Spv. Berube:
- 2133 I know.
- 2134 Spv. Kramer:
- 2135 So, let's hold him to that.
- 2136 Spv. Berube:
- 2137 We've also asked him to bring it over. Well, just give us our \$8,800 worth of fence. Well, I don't want to do that.
- 2138 Spv. Kramer:
- 2139 Oh, I thought he offered to do that.
- 2140 Spv. Berube:
- 2141 Say it again?
- 2142 Spv. Kramer:
- 2143 I thought he offered to do that.
- 2144 Spv. Berube:
- 2145 No.
- 2146 Spv. Kramer:
- 2147 To you and Mr. Qualls, we decided we didn't want to store It.
- 2148 Spv. Berube:

2149 We didn't go to that extreme, but we've talked to him in the past about doing that. And it was like, oh, I don't

2150 have to do that. You know, it's going to cost you more. The 8,800 bucks, I need more money because the fence

actually costs more than that. So, it's kind of one of these, it's a sensitive situation, but we'll make the best of it at

- this point to recover what we've already got into it. That's what we got to do at this point.
- 2153 Spv. Kramer:
- 2154 All right.
- 2155 David Hamstra



- 2156 Two more things and I'll close the report.
- 2157 Spv. Berube:
- 2158 Excuse me. While we're on that subject, the new road is going to go in, is going to have to be an end point. I
- 2159 presume you've already...
- 2160 David Hamstra
- 2161 We took it right up to the gates.
- 2162 Spv. Berube:
- 2163 The existing gates.
- 2164 David Hamstra
- 2165 Yes.
- 2166 Spv. Berube:
- Then that'd be fine.
- 2168 David Hamstra
- 2169 Okay, good. Well, in conservation, Catherine Bowman went out there February 15th. Have you heard on her 2170 assessment?
- 2171 Spv. Kramer:
- 2172 I spoke with her. She ended up with 24 different monitoring sites.
- 2173 David Hamstra
- 2174 Okay.
- 2175 Spv. Kramer:

2176 It's pretty impressive. I think she has a really good thing but we are trying to regarner, if you remember, we 2177 talked about, staff was supposed to log and track hours done so that we could report it. This was six or eight 2178 months ago. Unfortunately, for whatever reason, word got back, that the Board decided that they no longer had 2179 to track hours and they stopped doing it. Well Water Management District, of course, Catherine needs those 2180 tracking logs and they're not there. So, they are trying to pull from past records to recreate

- 2181 David Hamstra
- 2182 Correct.
- 2183 Spv. Kramer:

as much of them as possible. And Catherine is directing them and giving them, or should be providing you with log sheets to keep, going forward, so that we will have the proper information to report to the Water

- 2186 Management District, on how much work is being done, where.
- 2187 Area Field Director Perez

I spoke with Catherine yesterday and spoke with Vincent and Brad. Brad actually sent me over an email earlier today with going back all the way to June of last year, looking through the dailys that he was sending over for our weeklys that we sent out. So, I have that email. I'm going to be going through it. It's not going to... in speaking with Catherine, what she really needed was, from us, was okay, give me the locations as much as possible that you could, you know, that you spend time at and the hours. We don't necessarily need the exact day. I think I

have enough information but is what I'm getting at from Brad to translate over to a spreadsheet, to provide to

- 2194 Catherine. So, she can then send off her report. And that came today. Then moving forward, Vincent's got the 2195 information.
- 2196 Spv. Kramer:
- 2197 We do have logs on chemical application, right? Isn't there a required log that the State requires us to keep?
- 2198 Area Field Director Perez
- 2199 Yeah, you have to, you're required to keep track of the product you use, but not necessarily...
- 2200 Spv. Kramer:
- 2201 Not necessarily where?
- 2202 Area Field Director Perez
- No, just amounts.
- 2204 Spv. Kramer:
- 2205 Oh, that's depressing.
- 2206 Area Field Director Perez
- 2207 Yeah.
- 2208 Spv. Kramer:
- 2209 But okay. So that, might help too, because I presume he's using a lot more chemical, the more he's going out.
- 2210 Area Field Director Perez
- 2211 Yeah. I mean, we should be able to find out, but again, she didn't really mean that, she didn't make that request.
- 2212 The biggest thing-
- 2213 Spv. Kramer:
- 2214 No, no.
- 2215 Area Field Director Perez
- 2216 ... was locations and...
- 2217 Spv. Kramer:
- $2218 \qquad \text{She mentioned that you could possibly use that.}$
- 2219 Area Field Director Perez



- 2220 Oh. Going back to look at dates? Right. Yeah. But I have information. I'm going to try to, I got that this afternoon,
- digest it and put it over to a spreadsheet so I can get It off.
- 2222 Spv. Kramer:
- Wonderful.
- 2224 Area Field Director Perez
- 2225 Sorry, David.
- 2226 David Hamstra
- 2227 Thank you
- 2228 Area Field Director Perez
- The floor is yours.
- 2230 David Hamstra

2231 You owe me a half for that. All right. Thanks. All right. Last thing. And this really, Brett will be talking about this

later is the Cherry Hill rear yard swale. I guess he's got a quote he'll present to you later this evening. So, I won't take that. And I'll stop there on the reports, unless you have any questions on the remaining items. I know we got

a lot more to go on. Any questions on the remaining items in the report?

- 2235 Spv. Kassel:
- 2236 Well, just the, the request.
- 2237 David Hamstra
- 2238 The change order request. Yeah. That was next.
- 2239 Spv. Kramer:
- 2240 You've already got everything for the House Bill 53 report that's due June 20th?
- 2241 David Hamstra
- 1 had the inventory. I don't have the, what they call the capacity analysis yet.
- 2243 Spv. Kramer:
- 2244 Okay. So, you still have to work on it.
- 2245 David Hamstra
- 2246 We're still trying to shake out with Tallahassee exactly what they need from the CDD.
- 2247 Spv. Kramer:
- 2248 And then again, that was an unknown previously.
- 2249 District Manager Montagna:

- 2250 I have a question on the storm water analysis. That's what we're talking about, right? Okay. Are you providing a
- 2251 proposal or is that just coming out, you're incorporating that into the change orders or is that going to be a 2252
- separate proposal? I know District Engineers right now in all my other districts are submitting those proposals to
- 2253 do that report that's due June.
- 2254 David Hamstra
- 2255 That'll kind of dovetail with the change order if they want to do it that way or submit a separate proposal.
- 2256 District Manager Montagna:
- 2257 Yeah. I just wanted to make sure.
- 2258 David Hamstra
- 2259 Yeah.
- 2260 District Manager Montagna:
- 2261 So we can, be sure its
- 2262 Spv. Kassel:
- 2263 Being addressed.
- 2264 Spv. Kramer:
- 2265 That's what I was concerned with and my understanding was that part and that's one of the reasons your billings 2266 are more than we originally expected, plus there's just a lot of work.
- 2267 David Hamstra
- 2268 Yep. Well, let's dovetail to that.
- 2269 Spv. Leet:
- 2270 Real quick. Sorry. Billy's Trail, is the plan for improvements, is that tied to the developer fixing their silt fence 2271 issue? Or are they independent issues?
- 2272 David Hamstra
- 2273 Can we talk about that publicly?
- 2274 Spv. Kramer:
- 2275 A little bit? And it's like, unfortunately the developer closed his permit out quickly without doing everything, but
- 2276 they allowed it to be closed out. The requirement for silt fencings and stable bank stabilizations and everything 2277 has slid to the home builder.
- 2278 David Hamstra
- 2279 Right.
- 2280 Spv. Kramer:

- 2281 They still have an open permit over on East Lake. They're in violation there. They never even pulled a permit for
- this one. So that gets even touchier because you can enforce against somebody with a permit. And what just does not make sense to me, it should be even worse that you don't even-
- 2284 David Hamstra
- 2285 Yeah, I know, it's this part that I don't get.
- 2286 Spv. Kramer:
- 2287 pull the permit. But it's not. Basically, they can't enforce against them if they haven't pulled a permit.
- 2288 Spv. Berube:
- 2289 Sounds like a cop out.
- 2290 Spv. Kramer:
- So anyway, there is work going on to try and get them in compliance. Doing much more work as far as upgradingBilly's Trail might be counterproductive until such time as that part is fixed.
- 2293 David Hamstra
- 2294 Both the slopes are sodded, stabilized, and then we don't have any more of this nonsense. It's incredible. I 2295 couldn't believe it when she told me about it.
- 2296 Spv. Berube:
- 2297 They don't have permits, right?
- 2298 Spv. Kramer:

I used to be in enforcement. And, back in my day, if you didn't pull a permit, we really stomped on your head. And, we were a little more lenient with those who maybe cut the edges on their permits. But if you didn't pull permit. Now, to hear that, well, if they didn't pull permit, they're not in our system then, you know. But they are trying to work with them to get them permitted. But the way the building is going in there, it may be all built out before...

- 2304 Spv. Berube:
- 2305 Government in action.
- 2306 Spv. Kramer:
- 2307 That's the report on that one.
- 2308 David Hamstra
- 2309 Yep.
- 2310 Spv. Leet:
- Okay, sorry.
- 2312 David Hamstra

2313 No, no, it's important, but it's frustrating. So, all right. So that's it for District Engineer Report. Change order 2314 number one, which I submitted through our agenda packet. Yes, we are off to an extraordinary pace just for the 2315 first three months. But I will say in all the CDDs I served, we are not doing construction documents at the pace 2316 we're doing them, we've done them for Garden Road, the alley way, boat storage, the swale, the dog park. And 2317 so, the plans and specs are typically not part of your traditional CDD work of broken sprinkler heads, sidewalks, 2318 potholes, but we are proceeding with these. We've got them on the street, but they're racking up quite a burden. 2319 So, I don't know, in the future, every time we do a Garden Road or an alley way, if you want to treat that as a 2320 separate proposal or just understand, and I hate to keep coming to you every couple months saying...

- 2321 Spv. Kassel:
- 2322 You need more money.
- 2323 David Hamstra
- 2324 Yeah, so...
- 2325 Spv. Kramer:
- 2326 So, we have a lot of deferred maintenance that we're having to face right now. We're playing catch up.
- 2327 Spv. Berube:
- 2328 My recollection is the first go around about a year ago was \$40,000, I think. Correct? The second go around was 2329 \$50,000?
- 2330 David Hamstra
- 2331 Well, \$50 was what I asked for, for this new fiscal year.
- 2332 Spv. Berube:
- 2333 Right.
- 2334 David Hamstra
- 2335 I don't know if... When I started with you guys. I think it was May or March.
- 2336 Spv. Berube:
- 2337 Yeah.
- 2338 David Hamstra
- 1 think it was \$25 or \$35k. And I think I asked for \$10k or something to finish the fiscal year. Don't quote me onthe numbers.
- 2341 Spv. Berube:
- No, that's okay. No, I saw, my recollection was the first fiscal year that you were here was \$40,000. Then we started this fiscal year with \$50k.
- 2344 David Hamstra
- 2345 Correct.



- 2346 Spv. Berube:
- 2347 So, we're at \$90k already. And I think you want another \$30k now? Is that the request?
- 2348 David Hamstra
- 2349 I'm going to ask for \$50k, not \$30k, but I'll tell you why.
- 2350 Spv. Berube:

2351 Okay. So, you know, here's my bottom line. You do great work. You're doing a lot of it. I get it, right. And I know it 2352 was a lot of work and the work is high quality. You're on time, the reports are detailed, all of that. But to ask the 2353 taxpayers here to swallow up \$120 to \$140,000 in about a 12-month, 14-month period is reallythis is a big 2354 number. And, I know you understand that and I am not complaining about the quality of work but I think our 2355 pace is, we're getting ahead of ourselves. One, because we haven't finished anything yet. And we're still looking 2356 forward and rolling, rolling, rolling and the dollars are adding up. And to your point, I would rather that each 2357 project be broken out individually. So, you can see how much it costs for the Garden Road, it's, \$155,000 maybe 2358 to pave it. We don't know what the engineering costs are, but it'd be nice to see it. It really doesn't matter. It's all 2359 the same amount of money, but it can be staggering when you look at how much you're actually spending to get 2360 something done.

- 2361 David Hamstra
- And you see my invoices.
- 2363 District Manager Montagna:
- That's already done. You already do that.
- 2365 David Hamstra
- 2366 My invoices I do every week.
- 2367 Spv. Berube:
- 2368 Yeah, but it's not...
- 2369 David Hamstra

2370 Yeah, I didn't summarize them but as a rule of thumb, engineers fees are usually 10 to 12% of the construction

2371 costs. So, between all the projects we talked about, you're going to be hitting a million dollars pretty soon. That's

about \$100,000 just ballpark numbers for just all the engineering plans and specs, not to include all the day to

- 2373 day stuff with Harmony CDD.
- 2374 Spv. Berube:
- 2375 I'm not asking you to justify what you're doing. There's no question with the quality. I'm just bringing up; the pace
- is fast. We're spending a lot of money on the engineering side and we're now going to touch at least \$120, maybe
- 2377 \$140,000 in a 12 to 14 month period. That's a lot of dough. Should we continue?
- 2378 David Hamstra
- 2379 Well, this was going to be my next question to the Board.

#### 2380 Spv. Berube:

You're into this, you know, you got to kind of, but we need to fix the budget for the upcoming year. So, we're not
blowing through the budget. I mean, in the first year here, I think our engineering budget was \$5,000 and I think
last year was not anticipating all this was, was \$10,000. So, we've gone significantly over.

- 2384 District Manager Montagna:
- 2385 Well, it's \$20,000, or \$22k.
- 2386 Spv. Kramer:

The good news is that we have put the brakes on our excessive legal spending, which was well over \$100,000 a year. We've dropped that well back to about \$48,000 a year. So, and we are catching up on a lot of critical, critical projects. Can we do better in using David's time more wisely? Because when he first came on, there were a lot of asks of him, of things that should have been done by Field Services and District folks. And he spent a lot of time doing things that may not have been just totally engineering that we are learning as we go into this.

- 2392 David Hamstra
- And that has got a lot better with Vincent and Brett on board.
- 2394 Spv. Kramer:
- 2395 Yes.
- 2396 Spv. Berube:

Yeah. And you know, and the other thing is when a new engineer comes on board, just like a new lawyer, any new professional, there's a learning curve up front. So, a lot of time gets devoted to learning the ways and means of what's going on around here. And that's not being, I don't want you to take anything I am saying as being critical.

- 2401 Spv. Kramer:
- 2402 Right.
- 2403 Spv. Berube:

And you know, we understand you make a living at this and your work is beyond reproach and you are wellequipped when you come here and you're doing an excellent job. I'm just looking at that big dollar amount, and I'm sure you do too. You know, you're aware of it.

- 2407 David Hamstra
- 2408 Үер.
- 2409 Spv. Kramer:
- And, again, like I said, we are picking up, we did a lot of things flying by the seat of our pants before David came on because...
- 2412 Spv. Kassel:
- 2413 Well, our engineer was not-



- 2414 Spv. Kramer:
- 2415 Right. Not responsible.
- 2416 Spv. Kassel:
- 2417 Right, right. Not very responsive.
- 2418 Spv. Kramer:
- And it got us into trouble sometimes. And I think now we are on the right course. We are making up for lost time on a lot of the improvements that we're working through and we will get to where it will even out.
- 2421 David Hamstra
- 2422 Well, that was going to be my point.
- 2423 Spv. Kramer:
- 2424 Right.
- 2425 David Hamstra
- Garden Road, the alley way, the boat storage area. Those are your big three capital projects. At that point, do you
- take your breath for a couple months and just think of those built and unless there's broken pipes in the Estates, I
- think you're, that I'm aware of, that I think your big ticket items are done or caught up.
- 2429 Spv. Kramer:
- 2430 Right.
- 2431 David Hamstra

2432 So, I can be back to the traditional CDD type work, not plans, production, permitting, bid documents for all these

2433 contractors. But, I went through all my notes ever since I've started and I think once the alley way hits the street

in the RV boat area, I think all the capital projects I'm aware are, will be under construction this fiscal year. So,

- there should be a big drop off in our design plans, permitting services we're doing for you guys.
- 2436 District Manager Montagna:
- 2437 And there, the only thing left would be the storm water analysis, which is a big project in itself.
- 2438 David Hamstra
- 2439 Yes, which I think will be a separate proposal.
- 2440 District Manager Montagna:
- 2441 Yeah. Because it-
- 2442 Spv. Kassel:
- 2443 Oh, beyond the-
- 2444 District Manager Montagna:



- 2445 That's a big project.
- 2446 Spv. Kassel:
- 2447 Beyond the change order?
- 2448 David Hamstra

Well, the House Bill that's required on June 30th, the inventory's been done. We did the inventory almost from day one when we got here. It's this analysis. You guys are not quite built out yet, so this capacity analysis has to do with your future growth and demand on your system. Some CDDs are built out already. That portion gets really easy, but I'm still investigating how much the CDD versus cities and counties have to put into this energy or efforts. I'm trying to get that wrapped up.

- 2454 District Manager Montagna:
- 1 have to provide him and work with him on a lot of that too. Budgets, it also determines a five year plan. I have provide him all the numbers and all that stuff. So, it's a pretty extensive, I don't really know why they decided
- 2450 to provide nim all the numbers and all 2457 to do it this year, but...
  - 2458 Spv. Kassel:
  - 2459 But just to clarify, that work is not included in the requested change order.
  - 2460 David Hamstra

2461 I like to say I hope it is, but I don't want sit here and say it is for sure it is. I'd rather find out exactly that our scope

about the work versus what info Mike Inframark will be providing. I like to say I can do it before we exhaust this

2463 \$50,000 in requests, but by all means, next month, once we get into great detail, I'll be able to tell you for sure

- that, what it involves.
- 2465 Spv. Kassel:
- 2466 So do we, are you then requesting we table the change order until then-
- 2467 David Hamstra
- 2468 No, I'm already
- 2469 District Manager Montagna:
- 2470 No, he's already broke that.
- 2471 David Hamstra
- 2472 I'm already floating
- 2473 Spv. Kramer:
- 2474 He's floating three grand
- 2475 David Hamstra
- 2476 We're floating \$18,000 already now because we just finished the alley way stuff for the street.



2477	Speaker 6
2478	Yeah.
2479	David Hamstra
2480	So, I mean, we're, we've been moving to keep this stuff on the streets.
2481	Sny Porubo
2481	Spv. Berube: So back up. Your \$18,000 into whatever additional we approved?
2483	David Hamstra
2484 2485	I already done the last, the first six weeks of this year, which is January and half of February. I'm already \$18k to my \$30k. That's why I'm sitting here, respectfully saying \$50k instead of \$30k is what I'm asking.
2486	Spv. Berube:
2487	So, what you're saying is if we give you \$30k, there's only \$12,000 left.
2488	David Hamstra
2489	Right. For February and March.
2400	
2490 2401	Spv. Kassel:
2491	Oh, so you're changing the change order because the change order was for \$30,000.
2492	David Hamstra
2493	Yeah, I know. That's why, yeah. That's what it's going to be, unfortunately, with what we've been moving along to
2494	get everything else in the street.
2495	District Manger Montagna:
2496	The good thing is moving forward after this year, that storm water analysis won't be
2497	David Hamstra
2498	It's gone.
2499	District Manager Montagna:
2500	A big chunk. Yeah.
2501	David Hamstra
2502	All your capital projects will be under construction and you'll be back to normal business.
2503	Spv. Kassel:
2504	And the projects we have next
2505	Spv. Berube:



- No. You're never done. With a 20 plus year old project you're never done. I said what I said, we're between a rock
- and a hard place, we have to continue. We know we're already in \$18,000.
- 2508 Spv. Kassel:
- 2509 So, are you moving to approve the change order?
- 2510 Spv. Berube:
- 2511 No, I'm just saying something.
- 2512 Spv. Kassel:
- Is anybody?
- 2514 Spv. Kramer:
- 2515 I will entertain a motion at this point in time.
- 2516 Spv. Leet:
- 2517 Is there any more discussion? I mean, yeah. For...
- 2518 Spv. Berube:
- 2519 You mean, you know...
- 2520 David Hamstra
- 2521 You can do the \$30k, like I've asked for, and then when I tap out in February, March...
- 2522 Spv. Berube:
- 2523 You're going to be back.
- 2524 David Hamstra
- 2525 We'll be back and we'll see how much left work there's really left to do the remainder of this fiscal year.
- 2526 David Hamstra
- 2527 I'm already into it, but I'm just being honest and transparent.
- 2528 Spv. Leet:
- Right. So, if we were to do that, you would probably have a better sense of the, the storm water
- 2530 David Hamstra
- 2531 By next meeting, I will talk to Angel about how much is actually involved.
- 2532 Spv. Berube:
- 2533 Well, it doesn't matter if we approve now, he's going to come back for, you know.
- 2534 Spv. Kramer:

2535	It's just pushing off.	
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- 2536 Spv. Berube:
- It needs three Rolaids to cover all this. But again, this is not, I don't want to think, you know, it's not about you.It's about the total amount of money.
- 2539 David Hamstra
- 2540 Right. I take nothing personally sitting here.
- 2541 Spv. Berube:
- 1 will move to approve the change order request. Yeah. What else you going to do?
- 2543 Spv. Kassel:
- 2544 Which, which change order? The \$30k or \$50k?
- 2545 Spv. Berube:

2546 \$50k. What are you going to do? He's telling you, he's not going to make it through the fiscal year. We may not

2547 make it through at \$50k and as much as it bothers me, what are you going to do? Get him to April 15th and he

- 2548 says, "Hey, I'm out of money. I'm not doing anything else till October first," right?
- 2549 Spv. Kassel:
- 2550 I was waiting for you to make a motion.
- 2551 Spv. Berube:
- 2552 You get the rock over here and you get the hard place over there.
- 2553 Spv. Kramer:
- 2554 Okay, I have a motion to approve Pegasus change order number one as they have amended it to \$50,000.
- 2555 Spv. Kassel:
- 2556 Dan seconded it.
- 2557 Spv. Kramer:
- 2558 Dan, seconded it?

- 2560 Mike, he dropped off the Zoom at some point.
- 2561 Spv. Kassel:
- 2562 Who did?
- 2563 Spv. Kramer:
- 2564 Mike (Scarborough).



2565 2566	David When I started talking he left.
2567	Spv. Kramer:
2568	Didn't want his fingerprints on it.
2569	Spv. Kassel:
2570	Don't take it personally.
2571	Spv. Berube:
2572	He started hearing \$30,000, \$50,000.
2573	Spv. Kramer:
2574	All right, I have a motion to approve. All in favor?
2575	All Supervisors (with Scarborough being absent)
2576	Aye.

- 2613 Cheap, cheap is good and, but good ain't cheap, or something?
- 2614 District Manager Montagna:
- 2615 That was a good one, David.
- 2616 Area Field Director Perez:
- That was a good one.
- 2618 Spv. Kramer:
- 2619 All right, next item on the agenda is our District Counsel, Mr. Qualls.

- 2622 District Counsel Tim Qualls:
- 2623 Mr. Qualls

Yes, ma'am, thank you Madam Chair and members. I have before you a couple agreements for your consideration. One is the Blair and Bowman agreement. Essentially you all approved this last month, but what

- 2630 District Manager Montagna:
- 2631 Yes.
- 2632 Spv. Kramer:

l've got a few amendments on that. I could go over them here. I don't know if I'll bore people to death, but just,
we need to take out the word "propose" from our contract and actually shall include. I can get with Tim on that. I
just was able to review that this evening, or today. So, I'll get with you, Tim, on those little tweaks.

- 2636 Tim Qualls:
- 2637 Yeah, I don't think they're substantive because we took the proposal verbatim, so you guys could approve it 2638 subject to the fixing of these tweaks.
- 2639 Spv. Kassel:
- 2640 So, moved.
- 2641 Spv. Leet:
- 2642 Second.
- 2643 Spv. Kramer:
- 2644 We have a motion and a second to approve the contract with minor tweaks. All in favor?
- 2645 All Supervisors (Spv. Scarborough absent):
- 2646 Aye.
- 2647 Spv. Kramer:
- Aye. Any opposed? Hearing none, passed unanimously.

2654 Tim Qualls:

2655Okay, the next agreement before you is with a company called PropLogix. This was the assignment to work with2656this company and get a contract in front of you where the company would research the property records and get2657you a listing of the properties owned by the District. So, what you have before you is a good-faith negotiation

that both, PropLogix has agreed to and it's subject for your review.

#### 2659 Spv. Kramer:

2660 Okay. At the last meeting I had some questions, that we couldn't answer, so, I got on the phone with Stewart and 2661 we spent about a half an hour going over things.

- 2662 Spv. Kassel:
- 2663 Stewart Title?
- 2664 Spv. Kramer:
- 2665 No, Stewart Holley.
- 2666 Spv. Kassel:
- 2667 Oh.
- 2668 Spv. Kramer:

2669 He is our contract representative on this property ownership report. Basically, he explained to me what we would 2670 getting. They would be looking basically at the property appraisers' database, and then pulling the deeds. They're 2671 going from today's date back maybe one or two deeds. The problem is, and I put our specific issue before him, 2672 and he said, "No, this report would not have found the issue with the B1, U1, U2 because it happened three 2673 deeds ago. They will be giving a list of properties and the deeds associated with them as is the most recent in the 2674 property records for us, but that would not uncover the real issues that we're looking for, which is stuff that 2675 happened historically where Birchwood deeded it to us and then later on, Harmony Florida Land deeded it 2676 someone else mistakenly. So, he said that it wouldn't find anything like that. The other thing it won't find if any of 2677 these properties, these deeds come up with a metes and bounds description. It would be additional dollars to go 2678 ahead and figure out what on the map corresponds with that particular parcel. So again, there are definite holes 2679 in this. This will just give us a list of, of basically, kind of what we already know we own.

- 2680 Spv. Kramer:
- 2681 It won't find the errors, past errors-
- 2682 Spv. Berube:
- I talked to them last month. That's what we asked for was an inventory of property that we already own, and thatwas my intention.
- 2685 Spv. Kramer:
- 2686 This isn't going to give you that.
- 2687 Tim Qualls

2688 But what the contract says is that the contractor will utilize industry standards in order to delineate the 2689 properties owned by the District, so that they will go through the records and they will pull up everything in the 2690 records that is showing as being owned in fee simple by your District.

- 2691 Spv. Berube:
- 2692 I think what Madam Chairwoman is looking for is a title search. It's different from an inventory.

#### 2693 Spv. Kramer:

Right. Basically what, what we were looking for is going back to our inception, seeing what was deeded to us, which again, we should have been keeping records of all this, so seeing what's deeded to us and then we would know what we owned. But right now there were things that were deeded to us that subsequently were sold inappropriately by someone else. It's not going to find any of those. Those are the real ones in question. I can go to property appraiser's database and see the 90% of properties we know we own. The question is, which of those other remaining properties might we own but we don't know we own?

- 2700 Mr. Qualls
- 2701 That's a, that's a
- 2702 Spv. Berube:
- 2703 That's a title search.
- 2704 Tim Qualls

request to find, to ask somebody to find something that you don't know you own if it's not reflected in the records. See, my impression was these 2000, the '03, the 2003 deed and the 2005 corrected deed would pop up and show that you guys still own tract B1, and I don't know why that wouldn't be the case. That's what the record indicates.

- 2709 Spv. Kramer:
- 2710 That's what we corrected it to indicate.
- 2711 Tim Qualls

2712 So that's what the record would indicate now, based on the deeds, in the Osceola County, clerk's records. You

- 2713 can still pull up those two deeds now.
- 2714 Spv. Kramer:

2715 But in my discussion with him, he said that if he had gone before we corrected the property appraiser's database,

if he had gone to that parcel, he would have pulled the deeds from Harmony Florida Land to Harmony Retail and

2717 Compass Trading, Harmony Retail. But he would not or and he might have even gone back one more, which

- would show Birchwood to Harmony Florida Land, but he never would have gotten to that 2003 deed that is the
- true and accurate deed of record.
- 2720 Spv. Kassel:
- 2721 Who has the deed?
- 2722 Spv. Berube:
- 2723 I agree that that's what you're looking for. I also think that this scope does not contemplate what you wanted.
- 2724 Spv. Kramer:

2725 No, it doesn't, and that is what I'm saying. I mean, if the Board wants to go ahead with this for \$1,000, but I think

we can get the same thing pretty much in a report run by the County.

2727 Spv. Berube:

Sure, sure, I've bought and sold a few houses and a couple pieces of land here or there, if you want to know what happened all the way back, you got to pay for a title search.

- 2730 Spv. Kramer:
- 2731 You got to go back.
- 2732 Spv. Berube:
- 2733 That would be, that would be a lot of money and a lot of time.
- 2734 Spv. Kramer:
- 2735 And we may need to look at something but again, this, to me, this is not the answer that we're looking for.
- 2736 Spv. Berube:
- 2737 No. It is in that it would give you your list of inventory that we own according to a third party's database, being
- the property appraiser, and as everybody agrees, 90% correct, 10%... And it's the 10% ones that can get you in

trouble sometimes, right? So, you know, and maybe those numbers vary, but I don't know how you do this

- besides a title search.
- 2741 Spv. Kramer:

And again, I don't want to be the one doing it if we can find a company or someone who has experience in this that wants to dig into this puzzle. It's not that difficult to do, you just have to go back to the original plat, and you have to start basically at 2000 and pull. And I don't, and he didn't seem to think that he could do this. But go back to the deeds that were registered in 2000 and come forward instead of going from today's date going backwards.

- 2746 My guess is the CDD, there was very little that the CDD conveyed to anybody else.
- 2747 Spv. Berube:
- Almost nothing.
- 2749 Spv. Kramer:
- 2750 You guys have accepted but you have to-
- 2751 Tim Qualls
- 2752 Right. CDD is just the boundary. Yeah.
- 2753 Spv. Kramer:
- Right. So, if we can go back to 2000 and come forward with a deed search and get all of those, then that would give us what we're looking for. So, I don't know if there's anyone else that you know of, Tim, that can do that.
- 2756 Spv. Berube:
- 2757 I think a land use attorney would understand.
- 2758 Spv. Kassel:
- 2759 Can Tim do it?



- 2760 Spv. Berube:
- He's not a land use attorney. But a land use attorney would understand how to do this, I think.
- 2762 Spv. Kramer:
- 2763 Well, it's a property attorney, yeah.
- Tim Qualls:

We can, understanding better what we're looking for here, and I'm still not entirely clear. The good news is that there's no meeting of the minds here. You guys don't need to worry about this contract, and then we'll keep working, and try to find what it is that you're looking for. And I know we can figure this out.

2768 Spv. Berube:

2769 Counsel, I think, in simple terms, back in 2000 there was a master land deed for all of Harmony as we know it.

2770 Once 2000 took place and changes started to take place, that deed started getting chopped up, and I think what 2771 Madam Chairwoman wants to do is follow all those fingers from that original deed and follow them to their 2772 logical conclusion. There may be hundreds of them to get us from the master deed in 2000 to where we stand

- today in 2022. It's going to be a road map, I am phrasing that in simple terms?
- 2774 Spv. Kramer:

2775 Basically, start from there, find the deeds and a plat that convey property, and move forward. We'll, continue 2776 looking at that, but at this point in time, I recommend not going forward with this.

- 2777 Spv. Berube:
- 2778 No, not with this. This doesn't do what we want.
- 2779 Spv. Kramer:
- 2780 Okay. Any other comments on this proposal?
- 2781 Spv. Kramer:
- 2782 Did you have any comments, Tim, that you didn't provide earlier on B-1?
- 2783 Tim Qualls:

2784 No, no ma'am. I did review all the documents, I reviewed the email provided by, Mr. Pratt, and so, you guys have 2785 any specific questions, but I did research everything thoroughly. The only other thing that I had was, I did get an 2786 inquiry, from Supervisor Leet. Apparently, the gentleman that we sent the letter to about the dog attack was at 2787 the dog park again. The letter that we sent certified, he never, bothered to accept or go and pick up, but he does 2788 have the letter now. He hasn't requested a hearing. So, my recommendation is we, we've got to work with law 2789 enforcement and the folks at the animal shelter if this continues to be a problem and we needed to do an 2790 agreement with law enforcement to trespass him or with the animal shelter to help out as well. So, hopefully, 2791 though, now that he's gotten the letter he does not continue to insist on going where he no longer has privileges 2792 to go. I think the letter was very clear on that front.

2793 Spv. Berube:



- A trespass requires someone from the District, specifically this Board, to sign off on a trespass warning, I believe, correct? That's a question for you, Counsel.
- 2796 Tim Qualls:
- 2797 Yeah, I think, ultimately, we would show the letter we sent to law enforcement, and it's going to take law 2798 enforcement's willingness to address it and take measures into their hand.
- 2799 Spv. Berube:

From, past experience in this area, I know that deputies are loathe to enforce against a resident in his, on his public property. It's really a stretch to get them to do it.

- 2802 Spv. Kramer:
- Actually, in cities and counties they do it all the time.
- 2804 District Counsel Montagna:
- 2805 Do you have a trespass agreement on file with the Sheriff's Department, currently?
- 2806 Spv. Berube:
- 2807 No.
- 2808 District Manager Montagna:
- 2809 Oh, we have to do that first.
- 2810 Spv. Kramer:
- 2811 Tim, can you pull, together a trespass agreement for us?
- Tim Qualls:
- 2813 Sure.
- 2814 District Manager Montagna:
- 2815 That has to be filed, then they'll do it.
- 2816 Spv. Berube:
- 2817 Right, it's automatic. But you still got to get a deputy to enforce it.
- 2818 Spv. Kramer:
- 2819 And then, do we also need a form?
- Tim Qualls:
- 2821 What type of form?
- 2822 Spv. Kramer:

- 2823 Is there any other form that we need or just the agreement with the Sheriff's office saying that we've adopted
- the rules, because I think our rule 2.2 allows us to use trespass.
- Tim Qualls:

2826 Yeah, that was my understanding is that law enforcement just needed to know and to see specifically, where it 2827 said that this person could not trespass. That would be the letter. But I'll find any form and any agreement. We

- will get that taken care of.
- 2829 Spv. Berube:

It's multi-faceted. You need the trespass agreement. You need a complainant, you need a copy of the letter, and you need a deputy there when the trespasser is there. That's a lot that's all got to happen at once to make this enforceable. But we got to try, because somebody's playing games. I'm sure you would love it, I would love it, too.

Tim Qualls:

2835 You guys did the right thing, and we knew it would be difficult, but we will remain persistent because of the 2836 danger to the health and safety of your residents.

- 2837 Spv. Kramer:
- Thank you. Anything else for our District Legal Counsel? Okay, hearing nothing we will move on to our FieldManager's Report.

- 2842 Area Field Director Perez. Area Field Director:
- 2843 Area Field Director Perez::
- Well, we're out of time, it's eight o'clock.
- 2845 Spv. Berube:
- 2846 We always make time for you.
- 2847 All
- 2848 (laughs).
- 2849 Spv. Kramer:
- 2850 That's right. I must apologize. At the last meeting I promised him-
- 2851 Area Field Director Perez:
- That's okay.
- 2853 Spv. Kramer:
- 2854 ... to make sure we got him moved up, but.



- 2855 Area Field Director Perez:
- 2856 David kept the seat warm.
- 2857 Spv. Kramer:
- 2858 There you go.
- 2859 Spv. Berube:
- 2860 What's your name?
- 2861 Area Field Director Perez:
- 2862 Steve Berube. No, I'm joking.
- 2863 Spv. Berube:
- 2864 Does Mona still do these?
- 2865 Spv. Kramer:
- 2866 No.
- 2867 Area Field Director Perez:

Before we get into the big stuff. I don't remember what page it is, but in the agenda I had a quick overview of some action items. We already discussed the resident that was here tonight at 7048 Buttonbush Loop. That's already been discussed. So, we'll move on from that. Tow boat update. Photos are below. Jim said the boat should be wrapping up in two weeks. I got a text today that he put the slip-proof flooring in on the bow and the flooring, the hull. So that's moving along. He's, again, been great to work with. I know it's a little slow.

- 2873 Spv. Berube:
- 2874 Well, he spent a third of his day sending pictures and texts.
- 2875 Area Field Director Perez:

They come once a week. Typically. As you can see in the one picture below where the engine's at the, the kicker motor has the extension bar on it, and then the last step he'll be putting the U-handle to control that hull while standing. The swale restoration proposals, you know, again, there's, I think there's one in the agenda. I reached out to Cepra and Site Works. Cepra's been very slow to respond, and Site Works did provide their proposal, which again, we can jump down to that if we want to, or I can continue with this update.

- 2881 Spv. Berube:
- 2882 It's pretty pricey.
- 2883 Area Field Director Perez:

Yep. There's two options, I believe. One is per David's plans and the other one is what they kind of looked at and said, "Hey, we can do this instead."

- 2886 Spv. Kramer:
- All, both options are per David's plan. One uses a, I guess a mat and they said that they could use plywood.



2888	Spv. Kassel:
2889	And rocks.
2890	Spv. Kramer:
2891	And rocks.
2892	Spv. Kassel:
2892	So, I have a question. If we spend this money, how likely are we to get it back from the owner of the property?
2075	so, mare a question. If we spend this money, now intervale we to get it back nom the owner of the property.
2894	Spv. Berube:
2895	Not very. I've already heard from this gentleman multiple times.
2896	Spv. Kassel:
2897	What have you heard?
2898	Spv. Berube:
2899	He thinks he's being persecuted, he's not going to pay, good luck, how are going to collect, blah, blah, blah. I said,
2900	"These are all questions I can't answer. You should have answered the lawyer's letters three months ago. I'm
2901	sorry. That's just the way it is. You had your chance. You could have fixed it yourself, you chose not to." "Oh, we
2902	didn't think we needed to. Our pool didn't encroach. Good luck."
2903	Area Field Director Perez:
2904	That's probably a question that Tim will have to answer, because I'm not-
2905	Spv. Kramer:
2906	Tim.
2907	Spv. Berube:
2907	
2908	Well, I know how you collect.
2909	Tim Qualls:
2910	Yes, ma'am.
2911	Spv. Kramer:
2912	So, the swale that got used and abused when putting in a pool. And a fence. They laid sod back through the
2913	swale. We notified them that it was blocking the swale, it was improperly installed and blocking. You sent them a
2914	letter. They didn't respond until the time had expired already.
2915	Spv. Kassel:
2916	We spent a bunch of money to have a survey done and specs completed already. Now we have a proposal to
2917	spend 30 something thousand dollars to correct the issue. The question is, can we recoup any of this money from
2918	the owner, and how could we?

2919 Tim Qualls:

- 2920 Yeah, so I believe our letter said if they don't address it, we're going to address it and send them an invoice, and
- so I believe that ultimately the way that you would have to enforce that, I would say unfortunately, but the avenue I think would be to sue.
- 2923 Spv. Berube:
- Well, yeah, you sue them and then get a judgment against them and then turn it over to a collection attorney. Or turn it over to a collection attorney right up front.
- 2926 Tim
- 2927 Yeah, you'd get a judgment now.
- 2928 Spv. Berube:
- 2929 I know.
- 2930 Tim Qualls:
- You can get a lien on, against the property and you can follow that, but that, that would be way down the road after you get the judgment. But that, that would be the avenue I know of, if they're unwilling-
- 2933 Spv. Kramer:
- 2934 What is small claims court's limit?
- 2935 Tim Qualls:
- 2936 Your, your other option would be to sue them-
- 2937 Spv. Berube:
- 2938 5,000.
- 2939 Tim Qualls:
- before you spend the money to do the work, to address it up front and to say that it's their responsibility to fix it, and get a judgment saying that, and then you're not out the \$30,000.
- 2942 Spv. Berube:

Well, there's a little bit of a problem here. We're fixing the swale because we believe that the improper swale angles right now, or elevations, whatever you want to call it, are not conducive to good flood control. If we go file a lawsuit and it takes a year, we've already been a year with this messed up swale. You go file a lawsuit, takes another year. Now we've gone two years of wet seasons. Maybe it doesn't flood and we've just lost our case.

- 2947 Spv. Kramer:
- 2948 Well, it's already flooded last rainy season-
- 2949 Spv. Berube:
- 2950 I know. Is it that? Is it something else? Can you wait another year, is what I'm saying.
- 2951 Spv. Kramer:

Right. My frustration is that when they didn't do it, and I know it's not the perfect way to do it. What we really

should have done is rolled up the sod they had down, scrape some of the dirt down, put the sod back down and when it rains, see if it flowed. We've spent so much time doing it the right way, which I understand, but again, it's

2955 going to cost an outrageous amount of money.

2956 Spv. Berube:

The good way is go in quick and dirty with a Bobcat, skid steer, scrape it off, do it as you suggested, quick and dirty, then leave town. Done.

- 2959 Spv. Kramer:
- 2960 Leave town. See if it works. I don't know.
- 2961 Spv. Berube:

You got a \$32,000 risk here that we're probably never going to collect, to avoid some water running off in improper places that may or may not be corrected by this. I mean, that area is always flooded. It's gotten worse with all the people with pools, without a doubt.

2965 Spv. Kramer:

2966 Now, if we follow the engineering and we do this, it's going to drain. Swales work wonders when they're 2967 designed properly.

- 2968 Spv. Berube:
- l'm not arguing that.
- 2970 Spv. Kramer:
- But, the cost is, , like you said, I'm almost ready to send the Bobcat, our tractor out there.
- 2972 Spv. Berube:
- Well, here's the problem, Madam Chairwoman. We're, already into it for the engineering costs, which I don't know what it is, but it's easily \$4,000 or \$5,000. We've got a survey out there at another \$2,200, right?
- 2975 Spv. Kramer:
- 2976 I don't remember.
- 2977 David Hamstra:
- 2978 It was \$900.
- 2979 Spv. Berube:
- 2980 to engineer the whole thing. David what did you say?
- 2981 David Hamstra:
- 2982 It was \$900 for this location.
- 2983 Spv. Berube:

- 2984 So, call it \$1,000, right, so we're in for \$4,000 or \$5,000 already to get where we need to be. Now we're 2985 contemplating taking the next step, which is surprisingly expensive.
- 2986 Spv. Kramer:
- 2987 But can Field Services take that next step?
- 2988 District Manager Montagna:
- 2989 That's what I was just going to say. I don't know who would be, wow. I don't know.
- 2990 Spv. Kramer:
- 2991 I mean, we've got the piece of equipment-
- 2992 Spv. Berube:

2993 Well, we don't have the skid steer, all we have is a tractor with a small bucket on the back and a bucket. You can't 2994 use the bucket, the front bucket. You potentially could use the rear bucket to go in and dig out the sod and dig a 2995 trench as big as you want. Remember the bucket's twelve inches wide. So, you'd probably go into that swale and 2996 make two or three passes off the back with the bucket on the back, and set it as deep as you want, and you need 2997 a continuing slope, right? You'd have to streamline it. Field services could do this work. Will it end up, and with a 2998 little bit of care, David's got the engineering drawings, they could get it done at probably minimal cost, and then 2999 you can decide do you leave the dirt there or do you re-sod it or whatever. It would only make sense to leave the 3000 dirt. It's a fairly large project, but it would save a lot of money.

- 3001 Spv. Leet:
- 3002 What's the confidence level, Brett?
- 3003 District Manager Montagna:
- 3004 Mine is zero, I can tell you that.
- 3005 Spv. Berube:

3006 Yeah, well, hear me out for a second. That little tractor is designed for people, we bought it for a reason. It's not 3007 hard to operate. It's designed for people who don't have an operator's license. It just requires a little bit of 3008 common sense.

- 3009 Spv. Leet:
- 3010 Right, but we-
- 3011 Spv. Berube:

And that requires somebody wants to get on that seat and is willing to play around a little bit. And I would suggest, before we make this decision, and we'll let Inframark talk to your people. You figure this out. But there's lots of area that we own over by the office and all that. You can take the tractor and see if somebody can go out

3015 there and play with it a little bit, an hour or two, and see if they can dig a nice trench, make it nice and clean, and

- 3016 get a little bit of an angle to it.
- 3017 Area Field Director Perez:



- 3018 Yeah, I mean, Vincent, how comfortable are you in using the backhoe on that?
- 3019 Vincent Morrell:
- 3020 Pretty good.
- 3021 Area Field Director Perez:
- 3022 You're fine?
- 3023 Vincent Morrell:
- 3024 Yep.
- 3025 District Manager Montagna:
- 3026 Are there lines or anything out there that can be...
- 3027 Area Field Director Perez:
- 3028 No
- 3029 Spv. Berube:
- 3030 No, there's not, there's no underground-
- 3031 Area Field Director Perez:
- 3032 We can still call 8-1-1 before we do-
- 3033 Spv. Berube:
- 3034 Oh, of course.
- 3035 Area Field Director Perez:
- 3036 We should-
- 3037 District Manager Montagna:
- 3038 Yeah.
- 3039 Area Field Director Perez:
- 3040 You must do that.
- 3041 Spv. Berube:
- 3042 Absolutely. And then, you know what you're looking for is, if I remember the drawings right, you have a peak in 3043 the middle of the swale and you want it to run downhill from that peak in the middle.
- 3044 David Hamstra:
- 3045 So, the swale is going fine, hits the pool area, went up a little bit and then into these boundaries.
- 3046 Area Field Director Perez:



- 3047 The good news is you're doing work within CDD property.
- 3048 David Hamstra:
- 3049 If, for any reason I thought you were getting close to private property, I would, but there's plenty of space out 3050 there. I don't care if Vincent wants to swing really wide to get around the house, it's all CDD property.
- 3051 District Manager Montagna:
- 3052 Okay, hat makes me feel better.
- 3053 Area Field Director Perez:
- 3054 Yeah, there's access to get back there. We'll go to the end of the street and then come back up the berm.
- 3055 Spv. Berube:
- 3056 Or going back up from where the school is.
- 3057 Area Field Director Perez:
- 3058 Yeah, I was going to say, or the front side of the street and go that way
- 3059 Spv. Berube:
- 3060 That tractor won't damage the sidewalks.
- 3061 Spv. Leet:
- 3062 It is pretty swampy on that west side there.
- 3063 Area Field Director Perez:
- 3064 Yeah. My point is we're in the dry season so if we're going to do it, we're going to do it now.
- 3065 Spv. Berube:
- 3066 And, Dan, that tractor's four wheel drive, so it'll go anywhere you want it to go.
- 3067 Area Field Director Perez:
- 3068 Oh, we don't want it to do more damage.
- 3069 Spv. Kramer:
- 3070 Yes.
- 3071 Tim Qualls:
- 3072 My recommendation is just do keep track of your time and your effort. Field staff as you work, we still should-
- 3073 District Manger Montagna:
- 3074 Yeah.
- 3075 Tim Qualls:



- 3076 at least try to readdress this with the individual that caused the problem.
- 3077 Spv. Kassel:
- 3078 Yeah, and send it to court.
- 3079 Spv. Berube:

And if he gives us a lot of flak about that we can say, "Hey, look. It was going to cost you \$32,000 plus the already added to that, engineering fees and all that. Field services got this done for you for \$1,000 plus the engineering, plus. We're taking 60%, 70% of the cost now be happy.

- 3083 Area Field Director Perez:
- 3084 So, you just locked me in at \$1,000.
- 3085 Spv. Berube:

3086 Now at your rate, now I mean, well, that's 20 minutes. And I forgot now, I'm sorry. But if you're comfortable, I 3087 think, from the Board's perspective, and I see you smiling and shaking your head that you're okay with it. It's not 3088 hard to operate, I understand.

- 3089 Area Field Director Perez:
- No, but, there's going to be additional costs, right? We're not going to leave the bare dirt, it's got to be sodded. So, we're going to have to get sod in there.
- 3092 Spv. Kramer:
- 3093 Well, if we can roll back the existing sod from the back. I don't know how that's going to work. If you tear it up-
- 3094 Area Field Director Perez:
- 3095 It's going to be hard. It's going to be hard.
- 3096 Spv. Kramer:
- 3097 If we tear it up then we're going to have to-
- 3098 Area Field Director Perez:
- 3099 Yeah, I mean, again, we have rakes, we have hard rakes, so again, there's going to be some fine grading with 3100 rakes and shovels and, you know, just to make sure it's, we're not going to just dig a trench and leave it rough.
- 3101 Spv. Berube:
- Here's the deal. You drag the pressure washer in there after you're done and you pour water down the swale and see if it all runs.
- 3104 Area Field Director Perez:
- 3105 You want hot water or just regular water?
- 3106 Spv. Berube:



- We're going to, we might get in hot water with this, but I would suggest cold water. You don't want anybody to get burned, right? But, I mean, you got 300 gallons of water.
- 3109 Area Field Director Perez:
- 3110 Yes. We can open it up and let it run-
- 3111 Spv. Berube:
- 3112 You can run it down. You can see if what he did is right. All it needs to do is go downhill from the embankment.
- 3113 Clean it all up, and then you took a point with sod. Servello does sod, it's Bahia, right?
- 3114 Area Field Director Perez:
- 3115 Yeah. We have other vendors we can also look at through other companies.
- 3116 Spv. Berube:
- 3117 Sure, there are other vendors, yeah.
- 3118 Area Field Director Perez:
- 3119 We're going to that point here in a second with, with, uh-
- 3120 Spv. Kassel:
- 3121 Okay.
- 3122 Spv. Berube
- 3123 You guys want to think about this? You want to play with it a little bit and come back next month and tell us that 3124 you think you're good or-
- 3125 District Manager Montagna:
- 3126 I think we should kick the can down the road.
- 3127 Area Field Director Perez:

No, we'll get moving on it. Vincent, put it on your to-do list for the next 30 days, please. Let's get on it. Let me know when you're doing it so I can come out and bill my hourly rate.

- 3130 Spv. Berube:
- 3131 \$2,000 every 20 minutes.
- 3132 District Manager Montagna:

3133 David, provide the scope and everything, the picture. Make sure everybody understands what's going on and 3134 what needs to be done.

- 3135 Area Field Director Perez:
- 3136 I have the plans and the, yeah.
- 3137 District Manager Montagna:

- 3138 Do you have it? Oh, okay. Perfect.
- 3139 Area Field Director Perez:
- 3140 I mean, it's not going to be to spec, but it'll be, we'll have an idea, yes.
- 3141 Spv. Berube:
- 3142 I can tell you what. You bring a contractor in it's not going to meet the engineering.
- 3143 Area Field Director Perez:

No, and I think some of thatyou're talking about laser grading and stuff like that with, I'm assuming, with some of David's specs, there's certain drops and falls that he wanted in there that, you know, we're not going to have

- that. We just need to get water from here to here and it's got to have some sort of fall.
- 3147 Spv. Leet:

3148 And David, we're, we're not going to paint ourselves into a corner, even if it takes him a couple passes to 3149 ultimately-

3150 David Hamstra:

3151 Yeah, no. I mean, surprising when we look at the permitted plans, that swale was never supposed to be there in

the first place. It's supposed to sheet flow off the property. It was also supposed to empty into the pond. And whatever change they made during constructing the homes or the lots they decided that they could take it down

- 3154 the other-
- 3155 Spv. Berube:

The change was, they had to dig, they had to drain that big pond, dig out thousands of yards of dirt and fill all that area higher so the sheet flow didn't flood the homes.

- 3158 Area Field Director Perez:
- 3159 Yeah, the lots had to go higher.
- 3160 Spv. Berube:
- 3161 So, when all those lots went up two or three feet-
- 3162 Spv. Kramer:
- 3163 Outrageous amount of fill.
- 3164 Spv. Berube:
- then they needed the swale to control the outfall. That's what happened.
- 3166 Area Field Director Perez:
- 3167 Okay, we'll get that, we'll get that moving.
- 3168 Spv. Berube:
- 3169 Sounds like a cooperative agreement from Field Services. Thank you both.

- 3170 Area Field Director Perez:
- 3171 We'll table, or you all can table the Site Works proposal.
- 3172 Area Field Director Perez:
- 3173 And you're going to put some time on that tractor.
- 3174 Brett:

3175 All right, moving along. Sidewalk panel replacement updates. ACPLM and Driveway Maintenance were both 3176 contacted, provided David's fantastic maps of all district-owned sidewalks with revisions that were pointed out, 3177 by Teresa on a couple sidewalk ownership pieces, so they all have them. ACPLM was supposed to have me, the 3178 proposal to me today. Orlando Driveway has reached out and said that they are still working on it as well. So, this 3179 proposal that we're looking at again, will address panels that are lifted, like the 7048 Buttonbush Loop discussion 3180 we had earlier, and all cracked panels. I believe there's one in the field report, which we'll get to, because I know 3181 Steve's itching to ask some questions on that. So that's what this proposal, when I get it next month will, it'll be 3182 included in the agenda package, both of those proposals, and we'll review it at that time.

3183 Spv. Berube:

Yeah, if I can interrupt for a second. We've been grinding sidewalks and replacing panels around here for four or five years now. When you look at the overall costs of grinding panels, sometimes two and three and four times, the cost of maintenance to that little machine and all that. If you can do panels relatively cheaply, which is where Orlando Driveway will be, and Napoli Russo, it very quickly becomes cheaper to just start replacing panels in groups. Not to mention that the first \$5,000 of each project per year, is paid by our insurance company. After watching hundreds of these things being ground and probably 100 or more being replaced. The replace is the way to go, and you solve the problem because you get rid of the roots. You grind them today, in six months it's

- 3191 back up because the roots keep growing up, right?
- 3192 Spv. Kramer:

3193 Yeah, what we need to be careful on that and we need to look at that closely, because in some of the research

3194 I've done, correct me if I'm wrong, Brett, when you start cutting those roots out, one, you potentially damage the 3195 trees and if you do it twice, then you're really causing a problem. Also, the tree has a tendency when you cut 3196 roots away, to concentrate its repair to that area and put out even more roots.

- 3197 Area Field Director Perez:
- 3198 Yeah, so it's a million dollar... Well, it's more than a million-dollar question, but-
- 3199 Spv. Kramer:

3200 So, the question is, do we need to start... The City of St. Cloud actually, instead of cutting the roots out puts their 3201 panels up and slopes over, so no longer do they have flat, level sidewalks.

3202 Area Field Director Perez:

Yeah, and there's that option, which again still doesn't alleviate the fact that over time those roots, you know, can still push them up, right? So, there are other districts, again, Celebration just had their meeting Tuesday night. This is a major topic, community trees, they don't want to lose trees, right? So, cutting the roots out, which is a process we're doing currently in Celebration, is it going to jeopardize the health of the tree? Are we going to see it right away, is, I think, the bigger question. I don't think you're going to see the tree deteriorate or fail as

rapidly as you would anticipate. Because again, you're not removing 75% of the root structure. You're removing
 maybe 20% to 25%, depending on how bad some of those panels are.

- 3210 Spv. Leet:
- How far down do they go? I mean-
- 3212 Area Field Director Perez:

3213 When you take the slabs out, when you take the panels out, that's a four-inch, five-inch panel. But now you're

3214 looking for the root that's underneath it. So, you have to cut that. Well, you're cutting it basically where the pad 3215 was at.

- 3216 Spv. Leet:
- 3217 Right, where it entered, yeah.
- 3218 Area Field Director Perez:

3219 Right. So, wherever you're taking pads out, if you're taking pads out of the length of this table, you're cutting out

- 3220 any roots that are protruding across the sidewalk in that area. Some of those roots can be six, eight inches.
- 3221 Spv. Berube:
- 3222 Oh, we've had them bigger than that.
- 3223 Area Field Director Perez:
- 3224 I'm just, again, examples, right? The next question that-
- 3225 Spv. Berube:

To your point though, on that point, we've replaced somewhere between 50 and 100 pads already. To my knowledge, we've never seen a decline in trees on any of them and it's scattered all around.

- 3228 Spv. Kramer:
- And you probably won't.
- 3230 Area Field Director Perez:

3231 So, where I was going with it was, there's options. And the options are do you start. And this is some of the 3232 discussion we're having at another district is, do you start taking down the larger trees and then replanting them?

- 3233 Spv. Berube:
- 3234 No.
- 3235 Area Field Director Perez:
- 3236 Same species, smaller tree. And then, in 20 or 30 years, you're having to worry about it again.
- 3237 Spv. Kramer:
- 3238 Right.

#### 3239 Area Field Director Perez:

3240 You can't eliminate them, because you have your site development plans. One, you can't eliminate them because 3241 of part of the beauty of these streets and where you live and is the tree canopy etc. So, you're not going to go on 3242 and change the site development plans for the community to replant with a different tree because you're talking 3243 about cost, up the wazoo there. You're not really going to win it either way, right? You're not. Some people are 3244 saying, like the gentleman here from Buttonbush, just take the tree out. I'll take it out. And then you'll have other 3245 residents, some here, that are saying, "Absolutely not. Don't touch it. We love it. This is what it is." Cutting the 3246 roots and replacing the panels are probably your best option at this point in the game, because even root 3247 barriers, once you cut the roots and you put the root barrier in, it's going to get to that barrier. It's going to go 3248 down or it's going to go over the root barrier and you're back in the same spot. Again, long-term option is you 3249 just got to keep replacing the panels. And if a tree fails because you've cut some roots out, you're not going to 3250 see it again in year one, year two, year three, dare I say year 10, 11, 12, more than likely. And then you take that 3251 tree out like we did with the sycamore that died and you replant, and you move on.

#### 3252 Spv. Berube:

3253 Orlando Driveway holds the contract with Orange County and they, countywide, they pull panels, cut roots, put 3254 panels back down. They're probably going to be pretty cost-effective on this, because this is what they do every 3255 day of the year in Orange County. So, we can, Brett is absolutely right, and I'm sure that their representative,... 3256 his name escapes me now, but I'm sure he'll come in and talk to you about this and their experience in Orange 3257 County. They're really nice people. I had them do a driveway in my house and that's how we found them. I said 3258 while he's, you know, talking to him, and I told him what we had going on here. He says, "We hold a contract in 3259 Orange County. We do this all day long. We're ready to go." So that's why he's got them on the proposal list. And 3260 that's what they do in Orange.

#### 3261 Area Field Director Perez:

So, it'll be next month. We'll have those, next month. And we can cross that bridge and have that discussion at that point. B&B Tree update, finally got some kinks out of their software. They were, should have been. Did they come today at all to store any, stage any equipment that you're aware? I didn't see any back there, but he reached out yesterday saying that they were going to swing by, drop off some equipment, should be starting tomorrow. But I have not received the map from him yet. The \$10,000.

- 3267 Spv. Kramer:
- 3268 Trim.
- 3269 Area Field Director Perez:
- 3270 trim that we started talking about two months ago, was approved, and then they-
- 3271 Spv. Kramer:
- 3272 Right. To get the limbs off the houses.
- 3273 Area Field Director Perez:

3274 So, that'll be starting tomorrow is what I was last told. Now again, they didn't drop any equipment off today, so I 3275 can reach out to Matthew tomorrow and find out what the holdup is. SPIES Pool update, Swim Club, we had a 3276 meeting out there. Derek has not followed up with me after my emails but I'm assuming, again, I'm assuming,

3277 which is a bad word to use in front of you all and on the record. But I have not paid the invoice for the Swim Club

- 3278 yet because I haven't gotten a response about if the work has been completed that we discussed, Teresa's part of3279 it.
- 3280 Spv. Kramer:

3281 I was there not too long ago and they had not done it yet.

3282 Spv. Berube:

3283 I was in there today. They had not touched it. Some things have declined a little bit. We have grout coming out 3284 of. You know the blue lines that delineate the swim lanes? Grout is coming out of them in a pretty good amount. 3285 But nothing else has been touched. The stains over by the ADA, the blotching on the bottom, and now there's... If 3286 you look carefully at the grout lines in those swim lanes, grout is coming up.

- 3287 Area Field Director Perez:
- 3288 I will follow up again with Derek tomorrow morning. I'll copy Angel on that.
- 3289 Spv. Kramer:
- 3290 Have we paid them anything?
- 3291 Area Field Director Perez:
- 3292 Nope.
- 3293 District Manager Montagna:
- 3294 Nope.
- 3295 Spv. Kramer:
- 3296 They didn't even ask for their 50% down?
- 3297 District Manager Montagna:
- They did.
- 3299 Area Field Director Perez:
- 3300 They did.
- 3301 Spv. Kramer:
- Oh, they did?
- 3303 Area Field Director Perez:
- 3304 On the Ashley Park pool, they did submit an invoice for a 50% down.
- 3305 Spv. Berube:
- 3306 But they didn't ask for 50% on Swim Club?
- 3307 Area Field Director Perez:

- 3308 They never sent the invoice.
- 3309 Spv. Berube:
- 3310 Oh, well, that's great. This is even better. Even better.
- 3311 Area Field Director Perez:
- 3312 Derek mentioned to me that it was never sent by his admin.
- 3313 Spv. Berube:
- 3314 I think I can find 12 or 13 more things wrong with that pool tomorrow.
- 3315 Spv. Kramer:
- 3316 So anyway, we're not going there.
- 3317 Spv. Berube:
- 3318 No, I'm just kidding.
- 3319 Area Field Director Perez:

We did have a very in-depth conversation with them aboutimproved quality at the Ashley Park pool, which they have started. Derek did send one update and I responded back to him saying, "This is great. You should probably

have started. Derek did send one update and I responded back to him saying, "This is great. You should probably continue doing that." And it's been radio silence since. So, moving onto tow signage.

- 3323 Spv. Berube:
- 3324 Can we hold up for a second?
- 3325 Area Field Director Perez:
- 3326 Okay.
- 3327 Spv. Berube:

3328 And go back to something that we should have talked about before? There's a proposal in Servello's package for

- 3329 Safari systemic insecticide treatment to the ground under the sycamores. Is that just a proposal?
- 3330 Area Field Director Perez:
- 3331 It is just a proposal.
- 3332 Spv. Berube:
- And we didn't discuss it tonight. Is there a reason? Or did we just miss it?
- 3334 District Manager Montagna:
- Because it's under the Field Report.
- 3336 Spv. Kramer:
- 3337 We were going to... Yeah. Discuss it under his report.



- 3338 Area Field Director Perez:
- 3339 Yep.
- 3340 Spv. Berube:
- 3341 Okay. Oh, it does say that. Never mind. I'm sorry.
- 3342 Area Field Director Perez:
- 3343 Okay. Floor's mine again.
- 3344 District Manger Montagna:
- 3345 You better buzz through this to get to your landscape RFP.
- 3346 Area Field Director Perez:

3347 Okay. Well, tow-signage has been installed at Ashley Park pool. We met with Teresa, Angel and I were onsite, 3348 Vincent, got a map. We had to make some minor adjustments after they were installed once or twice. But they 3349 should be where they need to be now. And the tow signage is also installed now at Swim Club. So, check that off 3350 the list. And we do have an SOP in place where we put a warning on. We leave it there for 24 hours. If it's not 3351 moved, then we're making a call.

- 3352 Spv. Kramer:
- 3353 And you are keeping a log? Because they don't get
- 3354 Area Field Director Perez:
- 3355 Yeah, so-
- 3356 Spv. Kramer:
- because they move it the one time doesn't mean they won't come back.
- 3358 Area Field Director Perez:
- 3359 So, I should probably back up on the SOP. The SOP, what we're really trying to target on these vehicles is if they

are there for multiple days and not moving. Not like hey, if Vincent shows up and he saw that car yesterday, you

- know, we want to give them, you know, maybe Vincent was there and they moved and then come back.
- 3362 Spv. Kramer:

3363 What I don't want and what we're seeing in Ashley Park pool is people are starting to use that to park in instead 3364 of the garage driveway.

- 3365 Area Field Director Perez:
- 3366 Correct.
- 3367 Spv. Kramer:

And they will move it to go to work. And you won't see it. But then it'll be back the next day and the next day and the next day.



- 3370 Spv. Berube:
- 3371 It's pretty easy at Ashley Park.
- 3372 Spv. Kramer:
- 3373 Yeah.
- 3374 Spv. Berube:

3375 You look at the cars that are parked, you look in the pool. If there's nobody in the pool, the car shouldn't be 3376 there.

- 3377 Spv. Kramer:
- 3378 Yeah.
- 3379 Spv. Berube:
- 3380 It's the same way at swim club.
- 3381 Spv. Kramer:
- 3382 Double-check the restrooms too
- 3383 Area Field Director Perez:

3384 Knock before you go in, please. If that's, if that's the direction you guys want then that's going to be pretty 3385 intensive monitoring, but...

3386 Spv. Kramer:

No, all you need is a little log that I gave a courtesy notice that this car or this car. Now, again, you know, I don't want it to be a full-time job for somebody. But you have enough people showing up to empty the trashcans and take care of the pool and stuff that if they see a car there, there's nobody in there, they can pull up the log and say, "Hey, that car's never been here. I need to give them a courtesy notice. Or hey, that car's been here several times and they've had a courtesy notice already and so it's time to call.

Area Field Director Perez:

3393 Just to make sure I'm crystal clear, and Vincent's sitting behind us, and he understands it. So, if they show up and 3394 there's nobody in the pool but there's a vehicle parked there, they can go in, put the courtesy notice on.

- 3395 Spv. Berube:
- 3396 Yes.
- 3397 Area Field Director Perez:
- 3398 If it's there when they come back in 24 hours. We're calling the tow company?
- 3399 Spv. Berube:
- 3400 Yep. That's what the sign says.
- 3401 Area Field Director Perez:



3402	All right.
3403	Spv. Kramer:
3404	And even if it's not there within 24 hours but it's back there the next day, it doesn't get a new courtesy notice.
3405	Spv. Kramer and District Manager Montagna:
3406	It gets towed.
3407	Area Field Director Perez:
3408	Okay. Vincent? Crystal clear.
3409	Spv. Berube:
3410	People tend to abuse it. A lot.
3411	Spv. Kramer:
3412	Yeah, they will time you out. And they will-
3413	Spv. Berube:
3414 3415	They even removed the original set of signs though and tossed them. And that's when we get into the rigmarole, we'll lose no signs. If they work.
3416	Area Field Director Perez:
3417	Yeah. Well, we did get new signs made. And then on top of that we have the tow signs from St. Cloud Towing.
3418	Spv. Kramer:
3419 3420	It's a little bit of a problem now. When the apartments go in, it's going to be a massive problem. So that's what we're hedging our bets on.
3421	Spv. Berube:
3422	And once a couple cars get towed legitimately, the problem's going to go away.
3423	Spv. Berube:
3424	Word spreads in 15 minutes after a car gets towed.
3425	District Manager Montagna:
3426	Oh my gosh, I heard within two minutes when the lady got towed.
3427	Spv. Berube:
3428	Oh, yeah. It doesn't take long.
3429	Area Field Director Perez:

- 3430 All right. Last update that's not on this list is the Buck Lake splash pad. We have quotes coming in for repairs. It
- has low pressure right now. We've had our guys look at it. We've had Avalon Pools, who's assisting us right now,
- take a look at it. There's something wrong. Something's not... We're not getting pressure to that.
- 3433 Spv. Berube:
- 3434 Yep. Is the row of valves on that bank. You've been down in the hole?
- 3435 Vincent Morrell:
- 3436 Yeah.
- 3437 Spv. Berube:

3438 You had that PVC pipe that runs across and there's a whole bunch of tubes that come off of it, there's valves up 3439 there similar to like you have on the toilet, you know? Those, the rubber gets eaten up by the the chlorine in the 3440 water. They go south. When that happens, you have low pressure.

- 3441 Vincent Morrell:
- 3442 Okay.
- 3443 Spv. Kramer:
- 3444 Doesn't Shawn replace these and we would order parts in bulk?
- 3445 Spv. Berube:
- 3446 We would. We would buy. If you look back at purchase records from, it might even be Amazon. Do you still have 3447 access to the old Amazon account? The history? Maybe? I don't know.
- 3448 Area Field Director Perez:
- 3449 Absolutely. Sorry. I forgot I was on the record.
- 3450 Spv. Berube:

3451 If you look at it, I think we would've bought them from there and you'd be buying six at a time. It's either six or

3452 seven. Count the valves. And they're like, \$50 a set. It's not American Standard, but it's something similar to that.

3453 You just shut down the water, you go and open up the valve, put the kit in, put it back together with the works.3454 It's good for another year. So that's the history.

- 3455 Spv. Kramer:
- 3456 I think I got an email on that whole issue that shows where to buy them, what to buy, stuff like that.
- 3457 Area Field Director Perez:
- 3458 Okay. That's good to know.
- 3459 Spv. Teresa:
- 3460 I will get, I will get that to you.
- 3461 Area Field Director Perez:



- Perfect. All right, what was next on that? We can go into the sycamore discussion before I get into the RFP, or if you want to go right to the RFP.
- 3464 Spv. Berube:
- 3465 We'll do the sycamore one. It might be quick. Please.
- 3466 Area Field Director Perez:
- 3467 Okay. Sycamores, this is the time of year we're going to re-treat them. So, again, we have the armored.
- 3468 Spv. Kramer:
- The wax scale.
- 3470 Area Field Director Perez:
- 3471 The wax scale. I was going to say armored scale. Sorry. Is back. Okay, there's no eradication, right? So, you know,
- 3472 these insects are coming back and this would be the ample time to treat to try to get control going into the flush
- 3473 of growth. So that's the thought behind and the reason we had IFAS doctors, professors looking into it.
- 3474 Spv. Kramer:
- Like Dr. Osbourne.
- 3476 Area Field Director Perez:
- 3477 Dr. Osbourne. We've sent off samples. Thank you, Teresa. That was the diagnosis. They said we should re-3478 treatnow. They sent us a giant synopsis with all these different products to use.
- 3479 Spv. Berube:
- 3480 We spent this exact same amount of money last year, but it was to treat for aphids. Is this-
- 3481 Spv. Kramer:
- 3482 It was for wax scale also. The problem is that you'll get the bulk of them and again, then if you re-treat right 3483 before, right as the trees are budding out, then we shouldn't have to retreat for a long time.
- 3484 Area Field Director Perez:
- 3485 Yeah. It's a systemic insecticide. So, the tree's taking it up and then when the insects get into it and they start 3486 doing what they're supposed to do, that insecticide is ingested and that causes the control.
- 3487 Spv. Berube:
- 3488 Well, here's my question. And that's why I brought it up before. We brought a tree expert online, B&B. Have we-
- 3489 Area Field Director Perez:
- 3490 He doesn't do that. He doesn't do that type of service in-house. He's more tree trimming versus spraying.
- 3491 Spv. Kassel:
- 3492 I move to approve the proposal.

3493	Spv. Kramer:			
3494	Okay. I have a motion to approve. Do I have a second?			
3495	Spv. Leet:			
3496	I'll second.			
3497	Spv. Kramer:			
3498	Motion and a second. All in favor?			
3499	Spv. Kassel:			
3500	Aye.			
3501	Spv. Leet:			
3502	Aye			
3503	Spv. Kramer:			
3504	Aye. All opposed?			
3505	Spv. Berube:			
3506	Nay.			
3507	Spv. Kramer:			
3508	Okay. Three to one.			
3509				
3510	On MOTION by Supv. Kassel seconded by Supv. Leet, with three			
3511	Supervisors in favor, and Supervisor Berube opposing, the			
3512	Board approved the proposal from Servello to treat the			
3513	Sycamore trees.			
3514				
3515	Spv. Berube:			
3516	And I'll just tell you why. It's a lot of money and I think we ought to have another quote, or two. Because that's			
3517	our policy.			
3518	Spv. Kassel:			
3519	That is our policy. That's true.			
3520	Spv. Berube:			
3521	I don't want to make any extra work for people, but we have a policy.			
3522	District Manager Montagna:			
3523	Well, what we're finding with that policy currently, is it's very difficult to find multiple proposals.			



- 3524 Spv. Berube:
- 3525 Yes.
- 3526 District Manager Montagna:
- For a lot of stuff. People, contractors, they're not coming out for small projects. They won't even bid. Some of them aren't even responsive. It is ridiculous.
- 3529 Spv. Kramer:
- 3530 But we got a screaming deal on the plumbing issue.
- 3531 District Manager Montagna:
- 3532 That is correct.
- 3533 Spv. Kramer:
- 3534 So, as much as we can, we can do this.
- 3535 District Manager Montagna:
- 3536 Yeah.
- 3537 Spv. Kramer:
- 3538 What Servello did was, they did hold their price from previously, even though the Safari has gone up quite a bit. I 3539 can't tell you for sure we're getting a good deal, but. They go around, they treat every single sycamore on 3540 property.
- 3541 Spv. Berube:
- 3542 I'm not arguing that. I'm just.
- 3543 Area Field Director Perez:
- 3544 I think timing... I think last year's timing impacted your control.
- 3545 Spv. Kramer:
- 3546 Right.
- 3547 Area Field Director Perez:
- 3548 So, I think if we get ahead of it. If you table this or change the motion-
- 3549 Spv. Berube:
- 3550 It's already approved.
- 3551 Area Field Director Perez:

3552 I'm just saying, if that happened, you're going to delay the timing again and you're not going to get the control

3553 you desire, so.



3554	Spv. Kassel:	
3555	Can we move on?	
3556	Area Field Director Perez:	
3557	We got three quotes. It's not on here. But you brought it up on the dog wash station. There's a drain that's	
3558	clogged. Three quotes to clean it out. Tom Parish was the cheapest. Vincent sent that over to Angel today, finally	
3559	got the last quote in. So, we'll be moving forward on getting them. I think it's \$650?

3560	Spv. Kramer:	
3561	Did they figure out what was clogging or where it is?	
3562	Area Field Director Perez:	
3563	We had them just come out and give us a price to get it unclogged.

3564	Spv. Kramer:	
3565	Okay. Okay. So that's a mystery drain and they're aware that it does not drain to the sewer system.	
3566	Area Field Director Perez:	
3567	Yeah, they're going to be snaking it, correct, Vincent?	
2569		
3568		
3569	Yep.	
3570	Area Field Director Perez:	
3571	With the pressure snake, you know, versus us going down there with the Okay.	
3572	Spv. Kramer:	
3573	Yeah. I don't want a lot of chemicals put down there because it's	
3574	Area Field Director Perez:	
3575	Drains to the stormwater system.	
5515		
3576	Spv. Berube:	
3577	Yeah, it may not go that far.	

- 3578 Area Field Director Perez:
- 3579 Is it a dry well?
- 3580 Spv. Berube:

3581 Yeah. The tree line that goes behind the cupola there? If I remember, there's piping that goes in there and

3582 there's, it's like a French drain. They got the four-inch pipe with the holes in it and a bed of rock, so when all the 3583 silt gets in, it backs up, and it clogs.



- 3584 Area Field Director Perez:
- 3585 Dog hair.
- 3586 Spv. Kassel:
- 3587 And probably tree roots and brush.
- 3588 Spv. Berube:

Probably all ingrown, yeah. And all those trees are probably growing on them. When I heard the dog drain, I remembered we've been down this road before somehow. Pretty sure it's a French drain under those trees back there somewhere. So, they can probably clean it and it'll probably be good for a little while and it's probably all silt and everything and mud, at the first elbow, more than likely.

3593 Area Field Director Perez:

3594 Okay. All right. Page 290 on your agenda. Harmony CDD Landscape RFP. So, basically this page, here is just some 3595 major discussion points on what changes were requested from different Board members and then some of my 3596 notes. And I believe, the bold highlighted areas, we need to review and see what you guys want to take in, take 3597 out, so on and so forth.

3598 Spv. Berube:

3599 I'm no expert, and I'm very comfortable with telling you that I trust you to put in what's important to us and 3600 move this forward. We are running out of time and we can, we blew and blathered back and forth on this for 3601 months. Here it is again. If we don't get it done, we're going to be into March. We're into budget season. This is 3602 going to get advertised and done, hopefully by August, so we can get a contractor picked, then get them in here 3603 ahead of Servellodeparting. Maybe it's still Servello.

- 3604 Area Field Director Perez:
- 3605 We want to have numbers back by May.
- 3606 District Manager Montagna:
- 3607 Right.
- 3608 Area Field Director Perez:
- 3609 May's meeting.
- 3610 Spv. Kramer:
- 3611 Okay.
- 3612 District Manager Montagna:
- 3613 So, for budget.
- 3614 Spv. Kramer:
- 3615 Quick, I need to hold on, Tim.
- 3616 Spv. Leet:



3617	He just disconnected. Sorry.
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3618 Spv. Kramer:

3619 Okay. We'll ask Tim in a minute. So, everybody's really gone over this and provided their comments. Are there 3620 any points of discussion that there may have been a conflict with that you need the Board to straighten out? Like

- 3621 I really think we ought to end our annuals.
- 3622 Spv. Berube:
- 3623 We should end our what?
- 3624 Area Field Director Perez:
- Annual rotations.
- 3626 Spv. Kassel:
- We don't have many annuals in the community, and it provides a real pop of color when people come in. I reallylove it.
- 3629 Spv. Kramer:
- 3630 But can't you do it with some natives instead of...
- 3631 Spv. Kassel:
- 3632 You know, I'm guessing that they are not, they're not going to be...
- 3633 Area Field Director Perez:
- 3634 They're not going to be hardy. They're just, you know-
- 3635 Spv. Kassel:
- 3636 Yeah.
- 3637 Spv. Berube:

Think back a few years, Kerul, when Davey got bold and cut down the number but put in bigger plants that lasted
longer. Remember those? They looked really nice. Because right now, they put them in. They're supposed to last
90 days. They go about 30 days and start to look like hell.

- 3641 Spv. Kassel:
- 3642 Yeah. Well, what happened with the pansies? Did they get eaten by the deer or something?
- 3643 Spv. Berube:
- 3644 I agree with you that the annuals should go away. We need something there. We're just throwing money after 3645 money after money.
- 3646 Area Field Director Perez:
- 3647 I think there... What we can do in the contract is, well, you take it out. Meaning it's bill at time of service.

- 3648 District Manager Montagna:
- 3649 Right. Right.
- 3650 Area Field Director Perez:
- 3651 Okay? Same thing with your mulch. Same thing with palm trimming.
- 3652 Spv. Kramer:
- 3653 Mm-hmm (affirmative).
- 3654 Area Field Director Perez:
- 3655 That's all out of your contact. You're not paying one twelfth of that total cost every month.
- 3656 Spv. Kramer:
- 3657 Mm-hmm (affirmative).
- 3658 Area Field Director Perez:

3659 Okay? So, take it out. So that way, if you want to come to them and say, "Hey, we don't want annuals anymore. 3660 Give us price on perennials." Maybe in the summer you're going with pentas that are going to last you from 3661 Spring to Fall. And then you switch it over to one annual rotation for, like, geraniums or something. I'm just 3662 throwing names out there. For the winter months to keep you through the cold. Fine. But it's a proposal. And you 3663 say yea or nay and then you move on. And then you keep those beds as seasonal color, but you're getting two 3664 rotations. The point of it is, is that you take it out of the contract. So, you're not financing one twelfth of it every 3665 month. And then if they don't last, you're going, "Well, shoot, I already paid you, you know, for this rotation. And 3666 it looks like heck." The goal would be when they put it in, we then hold them to a warranty on those plants. 3667 Versus, okay, you're putting them in now as one twelfth and they're supposed to last for three months, and they 3668 go two and then they take them out, say, "Oh, we're fixing the beds." All that stuff would change. We did the 3669 same thing at Celebration. Mulch comes out. You're not financing one twelfth. We're going to reserve the right 3670 on mulch and palm trimming to sub it out ourselves if we want to. We want to contact another vendor that's 3671 going to give us a better price, and we'll have a line item on the proposal. You know, when they deliver it to us. 3672 We want to see your cost per mulch per yard. And you're going to give us the estimated quantity of mulch. I'm 3673 not providing it. We're not providing it. Because they have to do their due diligence to go out and measure the-3674 the property properly. And then give us that number, okay?

- 3675 Spv. Kramer:
- 3676 And some of our beds need to be cleaned out. They just add mulch on top of mulch...
- 3677 Area Field Director Perez:

The biggest thing that I see, and this might not sit well with others, is the six times a year irrigation inspections is bogus. Okay? It's whack. Whatever you want to call it. I'm going to throw some hipster names at it, okay? It's terrible. Because for example, what we're seeing on that half of the community is and I don't know. Was that inspection done last month? If it was done last month, well, they're not looking at that section of the community at all this month. So, if you have breaks, if they're not reported, you have no way of knowing until they go back out and do the next inspection. And now your water bill has done this. So they should be, any contractor should be inspecting the irrigation system 12 times a year.



- 3685 Spv. Kramer:
- 3686 So, we just need to put that in the new contract.
- 3687 Area Field Director Perez:
- 3688 Absolutely.
- 3689 Spv. Kramer:
- 3690 For whoever.
- 3691 Area Field Director Perez:
- 3692 And Celebration does it 24 times a year, just so you know. Every two weeks.
- 3693 Spv. Leet:
- 3694 So, what was the question for Tim?
- 3695 Spv. Kramer:
- 3696 For Tim, we're looking for the public bid cap. When do we have to go to public bid?
- 3697 Area Field Director Perez:
- 3698 Oh, you're over the threshold.
- 3699 District Manager Montagna:
- 3700 \$195k. Yeah, you're over that.
- Tim Qualls:
- 3702 \$195,000. Threshold
- 3703 Spv. Kramer:
- That's what I thought.
- 3705 Area Field Director Perez:

3706 Yeah. You're going to be over that on this. It'll be a public notification. It'll be public and we'll have... The way I3707 like to do it is we'll have a pre-meet and we'll come onsite-

- 3708 Spv. Kramer:
- Thank you, Tim.
- 3710 Area Field Director Perez:

3711 Thank you, Tim. We will come onsite. I'll get with David and we'll make sure that the property map is up to date,

3712 the maintenance map is fully up to date. So that's something that we do need David to do. Not to add to your-

3713 David, don't come with a change order. I'm telling you right now. Probably not so cheap, okay? So, we'll need an

3714 updated property map that encompasses all of-



- 3715 Spv. Kramer:
- 3716 And hopefully we'll know what property.
- 3717 Area Field Director Perez:
- 3718 Right. The only, the only questions that I have really is what do we want to do with pond mowing? We have that
- buffer zone, that littoral, the upland littoral shelf is what I'll call it, because it's not in the water. It's on the bank.
  Do we want to keep that?
- 3721 Spv. Berube:
- 3722 I've said it for years. Mow it to the edge of the pond.
- 3723 Spv. Leet:
- 3724 I thought that was policy for us.
- 3725 Area Field Director Perez:
- That's why I'm asking.
- 3727 Spv. Kassel:
- 3728 I thought it was a twice a year, mow it to the edge.
- 3729 Spv. Berube:
- No, they don't mow it to the edge.
- 3731 Spv. Kramer:
- 3732 We've got a problem right now in that we have some invasive torpedo grass that's come in, has populated that
- 3733 edge down to the waterline, and because we don't mow it to there, it's seeding and it's actually getting into our
- ponds and causing a problem.
- 3735 Spv. Berube:
- We've always... Let me interrupt you for a second. We've always maintained that buffer zone because we think it's a filter for stuff coming down the slope, right? Fertilizer and all that. The fact of the matter is, unless the water is deeper than the grass, you don't need any more filter than the depth of the grass. Having three feet of weeds
- and other growth above that grass area doesn't do any good as a filter. So, all it does is make a mess.
- 3740 Spv. Kramer:
- We have to watch the erosion of the bank.
- 3742 Area Field Director Perez:

Here's what I'll do. Here's what I've seen done in other districts. There's an 18 to 24-inch-wide strip along the high watermark, okay? So, what we're going to call the pond bank. The high watermark. That's maintained 18 inches tall, okay? So, you don't have that three-foot-wide by twice a year. You get the three, four, five-foot-tall growth. Um, to your point on the torpedo grass, it's most of our lake banks in the community are non-irrigated Bahia, most of them, except for golf course sites, right? So, we can't even treat right? But we can't control weed

infestation, one, because it's not irrigated, and two, you can't treat that close to the water with landscape product. Now in the water, you can use a different product. So, what I'm getting at is if you want to maintain that, what's currently there two times a year, fine. I can make sure that's in the specifications. I'm going to just make the adjustments, because further down on the agenda is actually your current scope of services with notes.

- 3752 If you're okay with what's in there, I'll move forward. But the bigger questions I have are more leaf removal,
- ponds, and irrigation. You know, leaf removal's got to be in there as a property-wide.
- 3754 Spv. Kramer:
- 3755 Yes. And not like shovel and a pickup truck. It needs, they need to have some [crosstalk 02:44:53].
- 3756 Spv. Berube:
- 3757 You know what's funny? They complain that they get leaves back all over the place. They're using an open mesh3758 trailor, with little leaves.
- 3759 Area Field Director Perez:
- 3760 Yeah, well, you know, so again, how they collect the leaves, we're not going to dictate, right?
- 3761 Spv. Kramer:
- 3762 Right. But they need to understand that it's more than just blowing them from place to place.
- 3763 Area Field Director Perez:
- 3764 Yes. It's not blowing into bed or blowing, you know-
- 3765 Spv. Kramer:
- 3766 And we've got trees that produce leaves. Trust me.
- 3767 Area Field Director Perez:
- That's true.
- 3769 Spv. Kramer:
- The sycamores.
- 3771 Spv. Berube:

3772 Go back to your point about the ponds. The reason Servello doesn't do it, because they don't have a side arm 3773 mower They need a tractor with a side arm mower to get in ther and cut them and they don't have one. It's been

- 3774 that way forever. So, when we yell and scream at them every once in a while to get in there and cut it, they go in
- 3775 there with weed whackers and bush whackers and do it manually and just leave the pile of crap all over and it
- 3776 looks worse than what it did before they trimmed it. That needs to be part of that.
- 3777 Area Field Director Perez:
- Dan's got a question.
- 3779 Spv. Kramer:

I'm in agreement with the 18-inch and the smaller zone, because it affects the quality and the sunlight getting to our littoral zone plants. I do not want them... We need to have a company that is sensitive to Florida native landscaping and the littoral zones in the ponds. That knows that, you know, you don't just mow over all the littoral vegetation or when they come in... And I don't know if it's Servello or who, but they start killing off with herbicides our wax myrtles and other things growing around the lakes and our fern, nice ferns and all the beneficial plants that are growing, and leaving the trash plants and the invasive plants. I've got issues.

- 3786 Area Field Director Perez
- 3787 So, you're good with me changing the specifications to 18 to 24-inch buffers maintained at 18 inches as needed?
- 3788 Spv. Kramer:
- 3789 I am. As long as we have enough to prevent the erosion of our pond banks.
- 3790 Area Field Director Perez:

3791 So, again, the 18-inch and the buffer strip are going to, you know, it's root to shoot ratios. The taller the grass,

3792 typically the deeper the roots, right? So that's what you're really pushing. The good news with torpedo grass is

it's very similar to Bermuda grass. That's why it's almost impossible to get out of the bed. It pushes root system.

- 3794 Spv. Kramer:
- 3795 Yeah. And the only problem is that it grows out in the water.
- 3796 Area Field Director Perez:
- 3797 Unfortunately, Correct. It's an aquatic, it's an aquatic weed.
- 3798 Spv. Leet:
- Any management will be better than what we have now.
- 3800 Area Field Director Perez:
- 3801 Yes, and I'll have updated reporting mechanisms in there. We will frame it very similar to what we're doing with
- 3802 Celebration with detailed reports, attending meetings with monthly or as requested, it'll be in there. Do we have
- 3803 any buffer areas that have to be pushed back?
- 3804 Spv. Berube:
- 3805 Virtually all of them.
- 3806 Spv. Kramer:

And we have signs there, so they can see the edges of those buffer areas. And they need to be mowing up to the signs. They need to expose those signs. And keep that zone. Right now, they're letting it get further and further and further out.

3810 Area Field Director Perez:

3811 But that'll only be the District property. So, anything that abuts residential property will not be included, even

though it's District.



- 3813 Spv. Leet:
- 3814 No, those are only on conservation areas.
- 3815 Spv. Berube:

Conservation areas. Yeah. The signs you see, if it's a white sign on a four-by-four post, and it says conservation area, do not mow beyond this sign, and they're set up every 50 or 100 feet all along those areas. Now many

- 3818 areas, you got to go looking for them because they're four feet in the grass.
- 3819 Area Field Director Perez:

So, what may happen is you might have an initial cleanup. The last thing, and then I think I'll be able to wrap it up,I am reducing your mowing frequencies on Bahia.

- 3822 Spv. Kramer:
- 3823 Thank you.
- 3824 Area Field Director Perez:

3825 I'm going to reduce them to 32. Okay? Versus 41 to 45 I think is one of the specifications. However, we lay that 3826 out, we can, but that's going to improve your density of your Bahia grass. It's a low maintenance, low input turf 3827 grass. We're mowing it too short. There'll be mowing heights in there. I think your current specs say St. Augustine 3828 is like, two and a half to three and a half inches.

- 3829 Spv. Kassel:
- 3830 Not healthy.
- 3831 Area Field Director Perez:
- 3832 I don't know where that came from.
- 3833 Spv. Kramer:
- Not at all.
- 3835 Spv. Leet:
- 3836 Getting back to Billy's Trail again, do we, Is that acreage part of,
- 3837 Area Field Director Perez:
- 3838 We'll make sure David includes that on the map. The revised map that's free of charge. You're welcome.
- 3839 Spv. Kassel:
- Thank you, David.
- 3841 Area Field Director Perez:
- 3842 There's your cookies.
- 3843 Spv. Berube:



- 3844 Are you bringing cookies, too?
- 3845 Brett Peerez:

No. Angel. I don't bake. I think that's it. I would stay away from manpower requests. I know that was floated. The only reason I say that is each crew, each company might have 15 kick butt employees. And if we say, "Hey, you need 15," you're going to see a price driven by their labor rates and there, you know, If the company wants to send 30 guys out here for one day and mow the place out and trim it, does it matter? Or do they need to be here five days a week? Here's the best way to explain it. It's their kitchen. It's their ingredients. We're just giving them the recipe. I don't care how they make it as long as it tastes good. Okay?

- 3852 Spv. Berube:
- 3853 Manage the performance.
- 3854 Spv. Kramer:
- 3855 Right.
- 3856 Spv. Berube:
- 3857 The end result is what matters. If one guy can be here 24/7 and he gets it all done, so what?
- 3858 Spv. Kramer:
- 3859 That's right.
- 3860 Spv. Berube:
- 3861 But the fact of the matter is, over the years, we've learned it takes five guys and one supervisor.
- 3862 Area Field Director Perez:

3863 It, well, again, that all can be based on how good the body is. You know, how good the worker is. I will forewarn 3864 you that, don't be alarmed if prices are substantially higher than what you're currently paying. Material has gone 3865 up. Labor rates have gone up. I'm saying it across the board, you know, because it's a real cost.

3866 Spv. Kramer:

Now, selection in the past, have you used committees? We do, we do have some folks, I don't know what their
 position... We've got some retired folks who headed up the landscape divisions at Disney and stuff like that. I
 don't know how to rank a landscape proposal particularly well, so...

- 3870 District Manager Montagna:
- 3871 So, the criteria will be, I mean, it's pretty basic.
- 3872 Area Field Director Perez:
- 3873 It'll be price, personnel, location, experience, you know.
- 3874 Spv. Berube:
- 3875 And usually on a scale of 1 to 10, everybody ranks everybody. You turn it all in. You add up the ranks and...

- 3876 District Manager Montagna:
- 3877 You can also not do that and you can decide to rank as a Board.
- 3878 Spv. Berube:
- 3879 Okay.
- 3880 District Manager Montagna:
- 3881 You can talk
- 3882 Spv. Kramer:
- 3883 I didn't know.
- 3884 District Manager Montagna:
- 3885 There's different ways.
- 3886 Spv. Kramer:
- 3887 sat in on a couple Celebration meetings and they had committees that would do it and then make 3888 recommendations to the Board, and
- 3889 District Manager Montagna:
- 3890 You can do that.
- 3891 Area Field Director Perez:
- 3892 You can do that. There are plenty of ways to do it. Is Tim still on?
- 3893 Spv. Leet:
- 3894 Yeah.
- 3895 District Manager Montagna:
- 3896 You can narrow it down and only ask those particular contractors to come.
- 3897 Area Field Director Perez:

3898 I would highly suggest, on a job this size, you look at a bid bond or a performance bond. It's an insurance policy 3899 for you... where someone says, "Here's my price," and then they don't perform or they walk off on you. They owe 3900 that percent... Typically it's 10% of the contract. So, if you want that in there, I'll get with Tim and Angel and we'll 3901 add that language in.

- 3902 District Manager Montagna
- 3903 Yeah. I would recommend it as well.
- 3904 Area Field Director Perez:
- 3905 Tim, you good?



3906	Tim Qualls:		
3907	Perfect.		
3908	Spv. Berube:		
3909	We had, we had a walk away once.		
3910	Tim		
3911	I could do this all night, guys.		
3912	Spv. Kramer		
3913	That's because you don't have a drive home tonight, right?		
3914	District Manager Montagna:		
3914 3915	District Manager Montagna:		
5915	Right.		
3916	Area Field Director Perez:		
3917	We will get moving on that. I will finalize the RFP scope of services. And I can send them out individually to the		
3918	Board and not poll you, but just so you have an opportunity to see it, that way or we justI guess we can approve		
3919	it for next meeting.		
3920	Spv. Kramer:		
3921	Just do it.		
3922	District Manager Montagna:		
3923	I would ask tonight for a motion to approve the scope as Brett presented it. He's got everybody's feedback, so we		
3924			
3925	Spv. Kassel:		
3926	Motion to move forward the approved scope for the landscape RFP. Aye.

3927 3928	Spv. Leet: Second. Aye.
