Having formerly lived on Brackenfern, the sidewalk at that time had 80 been elevated slightly, that was completely replaced. The sidewalk over here is ridiculously raised. So, I'm 81 advocating that we replace that. Two, I'm also asking the Board if you can assess my front porch. I believe roots 82 are actually pushing up the base of my front porch. And I think they've reached the perimeter of the porch, and 83 they're pushing up, where my actual tiles are actually starting to break. And so, I'd like to have this reviewed or 84 assessed. 

So, there was probably pressure holding the pipe together better, and it opened up. With that being said, there's been some times where some things have happened out on a property, where I feel I should be out here on a weekly basis to monitor the Maxicom and make sure things are operational, and also the clocks and the maintenance on both the fertilizer and pest control side and the irrigation side. But that is what I would offer at this time. I also fee that, in the past, on the Maxicom, that, Mike Walker, with Walker Technical Services, has provided some service here. And as far as the last time he was here, I'm not sure if he's gone through the system, or is that, if that's something that the Board or community would like him to do, offer a service for, or not. |

Berube: 712 Supervisor Kassel probably remembers this. When we get into the retrofit of flow meters, the low number was 713 about \$60,000. The high number could easily have gone over \$100,000. The problem being, we don't know... 714 There's wires in the ground, spread around. You see the little caps. We don't know the quality of those wires. 715 We're not sure where they're connected. There's no, we'd have to go back and try to find that. 716 Scottie Feliciano: 717 Yeah, so it's useless doing it right now. 718 Spv. Berube: 719 Right. 720 Scottie Feliciano: 721 And you're going to go well over \$100,000, probably \$200,000. Plus the wires are probably tangled in tree roots, 722 and everything else. 723 Spv. Berube: 724 The flip side of that was they have wireless, 725 Kirk Allen 726 Flow meters. 727 Spv. Berube: 728 flow meters now. 729 But you'd have to have sending units around, you'd have to put a wireless in the trailer, where the computer is, 730 and all that. It's still going to be 60 to \$100,000. The, and when you look at, the payback on that, it was hard to 731 figure. But if you took 10% a year in savings, from broken meters that it catches, broken lines, you had a 10 to 15 732 year minimum payback. Maybe, if it works, right? So that was the, the reasoning, and that's why we didn't do it at 733 that time.

So, between the leaf litter, and 820 the lack of irrigation, it wasn't the shade from the trees, it wasn't the root growth, it was the fact that there were 821 too many leaves, too much acid sitting on the soil, not enough water getting watered. There was another spot, in 822 front of a house, further up, further south on Cat Brier, that was, is bulldozer blight and there's nothing you can 823 do. It's like the playground Buck Lane Park. So, I don't know if that's me. So, you can replace stuff there, but it 824 looks like the problem there is that people are just walking. I mean, they're literally just destroying whatever's 825 there, with either foot traffic, or I'm not sure exactly what's going on. But it's unlike what's elsewhere. It's clear 826 that the residents of that house are doing something, between the sidewalk and the curb, that is killing anything 827 you put there.

- I did reach out to the County Attorney, but I haven't spoken with them. However, in the email that was sent, Mr.
- 969 Pratt says that the County would not object to the CDD conveying track B-1.
- 970 Spv. Kramer:
- 971 Right. That is in there. They indicated, let's see if I can read my small print here. This is from Natasha Billyer,
- Assistant County Attorney, it says, "Good morning Mr. Pratt. As discussed, the county would not object to the
- 973 CDD conveying track B-1 to your client, but would reserve the right to require access onto/ from the property, as
- 974 it develops, consistent with applicable codes." Okay, so that seems like the County is saying that we can convey
- it, or we can sell it to them. Is that your interpretation, Mr. Qualls?

And, back in my day, if you didn't pull a permit, we really stomped on your head. 2300 And, we were a little more lenient with those who maybe cut the edges on their permits. But if you didn't pull 2301 permit. Now, to hear that, well, if they didn't pull permit, they're not in our system then, you know. But they are 2302 trying to work with them to get them permitted. But the way the building is going in there, it may be all built out 2303 before... 2304 Spv. Berube: 2305 Government in action. 2306 Spv. Kramer: 2307 That's the report on that one. 2308 David Hamstra 2309 Yep. 2310 Spv. Leet: 2311 Okay, sorry. 2312 David Hamstra

2313 No, no, it's important, but it's frustrating. So, all right. So that's it for District Engineer Report. Change order 2314 number one, which I submitted through our agenda packet. Yes, we are off to an extraordinary pace just for the 2315 first three months. But I will say in all the CDDs I served, we are not doing construction documents at the pace 2316 we're doing them, we've done them for Garden Road, the alley way, boat storage, the swale, the dog park. And 2317 so, the plans and specs are typically not part of your traditional CDD work of broken sprinkler heads, sidewalks, 2318 potholes, but we are proceeding with these. We've got them on the street, but they're racking up quite a burden. 2319 So, I don't know, in the future, every time we do a Garden Road or an alley way, if you want to treat that as a 2320 separate proposal or just understand, and I hate to keep coming to you every couple months saying... 2321 Spv. Kassel: 2322 You need more money. 2323 David Hamstra 2324 Yeah, so... 2325 Spv. Kramer: 2326 So, we have a lot of deferred maintenance that we're having to face right now. We're playing catch up. 2327 Spv. Berube: 2328 My recollection is the first go around about a year ago was \$40,000, I think. Correct? 2693 Spv. Kramer: 2694 Right. Basically what, what we were looking for is going back to our inception, seeing what was deeded to us, 2695 which again, we should have been keeping records of all this, so seeing what's deeded to us and then we would 2696 know what we owned. But right now there were things that were deeded to us that subsequently were sold 2697 inappropriately by someone else. It's not going to find any of those. Those are the real ones in question. I can go 2698 to property appraiser's database and see the 90% of properties we know we own. The question is, which of those 2699 other remaining properties might we own but we don't know we own? 2700 Mr. Qualls 2701 That's a, that's a 2702 Spv. Berube: 2703 That's a title search. 2704 Tim Qualls 2705 request to find, to ask somebody to find something that you don't know you own if it's not reflected in the 2706 records. See, my impression was these 2000, the '03, the 2003 deed and the 2005 corrected deed would pop up 2707 and show that you guys still own tract B1, and I don't know why that wouldn't be the case. That's what the record 2708 indicates. 2709 Spv. Kramer: 2710 That's what we corrected it to indicate. 2711 Tim Qualls 2712 So that's what the record would indicate now, based on the deeds, in the Osceola County, clerk's records. You 2713 can still pull up those two deeds now. 2714 Spv. Kramer: 2715 But in my discussion with him, he said that if he had gone before we corrected the property appraiser's database, 2716 if he had gone to that parcel, he would have pulled the deeds from Harmony Florida Land to Harmony Retail and 2717 Compass Trading, Harmony Retail. But he would not or and he might have even gone back one more, which 2718 would show Birchwood to Harmony Florida Land, but he never would have gotten to that 2003 deed that is the true and accurate deed of record. 2719 2720 Spv. Kassel: 2721 Who has the deed? 2722 Spv. Berube: 2723 I agree that that's what you're looking for. I also think that this scope does not contemplate what you wanted. 2724 Spv. Kramer: 2725 No, it doesn't, and that is what I'm saying. I mean, if the Board wants to go ahead with this for \$1,000, but I think 2726 we can get the same thing pretty much in a report run by the County.

2727 Spv. Berube: 2728 Sure, sure, I've bought and sold a few houses and a couple pieces of land here or there, if you want to know what 2729 happened all the way back, you got to pay for a title search. 2730 Spv. Kramer: 2731 You got to go back. 2732 Spv. Berube: 2733 That would be, that would be a lot of money and a lot of time. 2734 Spv. Kramer: 2735 And we may need to look at something but again, this, to me, this is not the answer that we're looking for. 2736 Spv. Berube: 2737 No. It is in that it would give you your list of inventory that we own according to a third party's database, being 2738 the property appraiser, and as everybody agrees, 90% correct, 10%... And it's the 10% ones that can get you in 2739 trouble sometimes, right? So, you know, and maybe those numbers vary, but I don't know how you do this 2740 besides a title search. 2741 Spv. Kramer: 2742 And again, I don't want to be the one doing it if we can find a company or someone who has experience in this 2743 that wants to dig into this puzzle. It's not that difficult to do, you just have to go back to the original plat, and you 2744 have to start basically at 2000 and pull. And I don't, and he didn't seem to think that he could do this. But go back 2745 to the deeds that were registered in 2000 and come forward instead of going from today's date going backwards. 2746 My guess is the CDD, there was very little that the CDD conveyed to anybody else. 2747 Spv. Berube: 2748 Almost nothing. 2749 Spv. Kramer: 2750 You guys have accepted but you have to-2751 Tim Qualls 2752 Right. CDD is just the boundary. Yeah. 2753 Spv. Kramer: 2754 Right. So, if we can go back to 2000 and come forward with a deed search and get all of those, then that would 2755 give us what we're looking for. So, I don't know if there's anyone else that you know of, Tim, that can do that. 2756 Spv. Berube: 2757 I think a land use attorney would understand. 2758 Spv. Kassel: 2759 Can Tim do it?

2760 Spv. Berube: 2761 He's not a land use attorney. But a land use attorney would understand how to do this, I think. 2762 Spv. Kramer: 2763 Well, it's a property attorney, yeah. 2764 Tim Qualls: 2765 We can, understanding better what we're looking for here, and I'm still not entirely clear. The good news is that 2766 there's no meeting of the minds here. You guys don't need to worry about this contract, and then we'll keep 2767 working, and try to find what it is that you're looking for. AndI know we can figure this out. 2768 Spv. Berube: 2769 Counsel, I think, in simple terms, back in 2000 there was a master land deed for all of Harmony as we know it. 2770 Once 2000 took place and changes started to take place, that deed started getting chopped up, and I think what 2771 Madam Chairwoman wants to do is follow all those fingers from that original deed and follow them to their 2772 logical conclusion. There may be hundreds of them to get us from the master deed in 2000 to where we stand 2773 today in 2022. It's going to be a road map, I am phrasing that in simple terms? 2774 Spv. Kramer: 2775 Basically, start from there, find the deeds and a plat that convey property, and move forward. We'll, continue 2776 looking at that, but at this point in time, I recommend not going forward with this. 2777 Spv. Berube: 2778 No, not with this. This doesn't do what we want. 2779 Spv. Kramer: 2780 Okay. Any other comments on this proposal? 2781 Spv. Kramer: 2782 Did you have any comments, Tim, that you didn't provide earlier on B-1? 2783 Tim Qualls: 2784 No, no ma'am. I did review all the documents, I reviewed the email provided by, Mr. Pratt, and so, you guys have 2785 any specific questions, but I did research everything thoroughly. The only other thing that I had was, I did get an 2786 inquiry, from Supervisor Leet. Apparently, the gentleman that we sent the letter to about the dog attack was at 2787 the dog park again. The letter that we sent certified, he never, bothered to accept or go and pick up, but he does 2788 have the letter now. He hasn't requested a hearing. So, my recommendation is we, we've got to work with law 2789 enforcement and the folks at the animal shelter if this continues to be a problem and we needed to do an 2790 agreement with law enforcement to trespass him or with the animal shelter to help out as well. So, hopefully, 2791 though, now that he's gotten the letter he does not continue to insist on going where he no longer has privileges 2792 to go. I think the letter was very clear on that front.

It would only make sense to leave the 3000 dirt. It's a fairly large project, but it would save a lot of money. 3001 Spv. Leet: 3002 What's the confidence level, Brett? 3003 District Manager Montagna: 3004 Mine is zero, I can tell you that. 3005 Spv. Berube: 3006 Yeah, well, hear me out for a second. That little tractor is designed for people, we bought it for a reason. It's not 3007 hard to operate. It's designed for people who don't have an operator's license. It just requires a little bit of 3008 common sense. 3009 Spv. Leet: 3010 Right, but we-3011 Spv. Berube: 3012 And that requires somebody wants to get on that seat and is willing to play around a little bit. Sidewalk panel replacement updates. ACPLM and Driveway Maintenance were both 3176 contacted, provided David's fantastic maps of all district-owned sidewalks with revisions that were pointed out, 3177 by Teresa on a couple sidewalk ownership pieces, so they all have them. ACPLM was supposed to have me, the 3178 proposal to me today. Orlando Driveway has reached out and said that they are still working on it as well. So, this 3179 proposal that we're looking at again, will address panels that are lifted, like the 7048 Buttonbush Loop discussion 3180 we had earlier, and all cracked panels. I believe there's one in the field report, which we'll get to, because I know 3181 Steve's itching to ask some questions on that. So that's what this proposal, when I get it next month will, it'll be 3182 included in the agenda package, both of those proposals, and we'll review it at that time. 3183 Spv. Berube: 3184 Yeah, if I can interrupt for a second. We've been grinding sidewalks and replacing panels around here for four or 3185 five years now. When you look at the overall costs of grinding panels, sometimes two and three and four times, 3186 the cost of maintenance to that little machine and all that. If you can do panels relatively cheaply, which is where 3187 Orlando Driveway will be, and Napoli Russo, it very quickly becomes cheaper to just start replacing panels in 3188 groups. Not to mention that the first \$5,000 of each project per year, is paid by our insurance company. After 3189 watching hundreds of these things being ground and probably 100 or more being replaced. The replace is the 3190 way to go, and you solve the problem because you get rid of the roots. You grind them today, in six months it's 3191 back up because the roots keep growing up, right? 3192 Spv. Kramer: 3193 Yeah, what we need to be careful on that and we need to look at that closely, because in some of the research 3194 I've done, correct me if I'm wrong, Brett, when you start cutting those roots out, one, you potentially damage the 3195 trees and if you do it twice, then you're really causing a problem. Also, the tree has a tendency when you cut 3196 roots away, to concentrate its repair to that area and put out even more roots. 3197 Area Field Director Perez: 3198 Yeah, so it's a million dollar... Well, it's more than a million-dollar question, but-3199 Spv. Kramer: 3200 So, the question is, do we need to start... The City of St. Cloud actually, instead of cutting the roots out puts their 3201 panels up and slopes over, so no longer do they have flat, level sidewalks. 3202 Area Field Director Perez: 3203 Yeah, and there's that option, which again still doesn't alleviate the fact that over time those roots, you know, 3204 can still push them up, right? So, there are other districts, again, Celebration just had their meeting Tuesday 3205 night. This is a major topic, community trees, they don't want to lose trees, right? So, cutting the roots out, which 3206 is a process we're doing currently in Celebration, is it going to jeopardize the health of the tree? Are we going to

see it right away, is, I think, the bigger question. I don't think you're going to see the tree deteriorate or fail as

| 3208<br>3209         | rapidly as you would anticipate. Because again, you're not removing 75% of the root structure. You're removing maybe 20% to 25%, depending on how bad some of those panels are.   |

- 3242 and change the site development plans for the community to replant with a different tree because you're talking
- 3243 about cost, up the wazoo there. You're not really going to win it either way, right? You're not. Some people are
- 3244 saying, like the gentleman here from Buttonbush, just take the tree out. I'll take it out. And then you'll have other
- 3245 residents, some here, that are saying, "Absolutely not. Don't touch it. We love it. This is what it is." Cutting the
- 3246 roots and replacing the panels are probably your best option at this point in the game, because even root
- 3247 barriers, once you cut the roots and you put the root barrier in, it's going to get to that barrier. It's going to go
- 3248 down or it's going to go over the root barrier and you're back in the same spot. Again, long-term option is you
- 3249 just got to keep replacing the panels. And if a tree fails because you've cut some roots out, you're not going to
- 3250 see it again in year one, year two, year three, dare I say year 10, 11, 12, more than likely. And then you take that
- 3251 tree out like we did with the sycamore that died and you replant, and you move on.
- 3252 Spv. Berube:
- 3253 Orlando Driveway holds the contract with Orange County and they, countywide, they pull panels, cut roots, put
- 3254 panels back down. They're probably going to be pretty cost-effective on this, because this is what they do every
- 3255 day of the year in Orange County. So, we can, Brett is absolutely right, and I'm sure that their representative,...
- 3256 his name escapes me now, but I'm sure he'll come in and talk to you about this and their experience in Orange
- 3257 County. They're really nice people. I had them do a driveway in my house and that's how we found them. I said

We've sent off samples. Thank you, Teresa. That was the diagnosis. They said we should re-3478 treatnow. They sent us a giant synopsis with all these different products to use. 3479 Spv. Berube: 3480 We spent this exact same amount of money last year, but it was to treat for aphids. Is this-3481 Spv. Kramer: 3482 It was for wax scale also. The problem is that you'll get the bulk of them and again, then if you re-treat right 3483 before, right as the trees are budding out, then we shouldn't have to retreat for a long time. 3484 Area Field Director Perez: 3485 Yeah. It's a systemic insecticide. So, the tree's taking it up and then when the insects get into it and they start 3486 doing what they're supposed to do, that insecticide is ingested and that causes the control. 3487 Spv. Berube: 3488 Well, here's my question. And that's why I brought it up before. We brought a tree expert online, B&B. Have we-3489 Area Field Director Perez: 3490 He doesn't do that.
